

The necktie has its origin in Croatia

(in Croatian: Kravata, English: Cravat, French: Cravate, German: Krawatte, Italian: Cravatta, Spanish: Corvatta)

The cravatas — the name originated from Croatian soldiers who served as mercenaries for the King of France during the Thirty Years' War. In their own way, with the cravat, the Croats have started conquering the world from the coasts of the Adriatic Sea from 17th century. The consequences of that conquering are today felt around the necks by 600 million businessmen worldwide.

Hum in Istria with a varying population of 18 – 23 people holds the Guinness World Record for being the smallest town in the world

The currency is named after a rodent

Croatian currency is known as the Kuna, which is the Croatian word for marten. A marten was a forest rodent whose highly prized skin was used to pay taxes in the Roman provinces of eastern Croatia.

The marten appeared on medieval coins before giving its name to the new currency in 1994. And the coins are named after a lime tree.

The Guinness Record holder of the largest white truffle belongs to a Croatian. A white truffle weighing 1.31 kg (2 lb 8 oz) was found near Buje, a town in Istria, Croatia.

Dubrovnik

Dubrovnik is more than a city. A perfect combination of past, present and future, of culture, heritage and natural beauty, it offers a unique experience and unforgettable holidays.

Lord Byron called this majestic walled city 'the pearl of the Adriatic,' and it is easy to see why. This UNESCO World Heritage Site is considered the best-preserved walled city in the Mediterranean with a seafront setting and dramatic mountain backdrop and is the latest must-see Mediterranean destination.

For many centuries Dubrovnik was an independent Republic, a proud cultural centre and an important Mediterranean trading power. Although no longer politically independent, it remains a centre of culture and tourism – a city of museums and galleries, a treasure trove of Baroque, Renaissance and medieval churches and palaces, famous for its annual Summer Festival, an international celebration of outstanding music and theatre. Add to all this the seductive charm of Mediterranean climate and coastal scenery of incomparable beauty, and you have a powerful magnet for international tourism.

These ancient fortifications were built with good reason – conquerors have always been attracted to Dubrovnik's beauty and wealth, even as recently as the last decade of the 20th century.

With more than 250 days of sunshine a year, Dubrovnik sunbathes even in winter, when the orange and lemon trees are filled with fruit. The average temperature is 10°C in winter and around 26°C in summer.

With its stone-tiled bell towers poking over the walls and marbled alleys, the city is little changed since it was a republic known as Ragusa. As one of the great maritime trading powers of the eastern Mediterranean, the republic had its peak from the Renaissance to the Napoleonic era. Protected by the city walls and well affiliated democratic hand of its nobility, the city thrived culturally. Trading all over the world they picked up 'the latest and the best', attracting famous architects, sculptors and painters. Their work still remains a harmonious showcase of art and civil, religious and military architecture from the Renaissance and Baroque periods.



Did you know?

› Richard the Lionheart, King of England, came to Dubrovnik in the autumn of 1192, on his return from the crusades. He took shelter from a storm on the island of Lokrum.

› In 1296 the Dubrovnik Republic built a sewage system which is still in use.

› The pharmacy in the Franciscan monastery in Dubrovnik has been operating continuously since 1317.

› The first quarantine in the world was established in Dubrovnik in 1377. Travellers arriving from areas infected with contagious disease were separated and held in the quarantine until they were proven to be healthy.

› Dubrovnik passed a resolution abolishing slavery and forbidding the transport of slaves on 27 January 1416, making it the first state in Europe to abolish slavery.

› The orphanage founded at the Convent of St. Claire in 1432 was one of the first in the world.

› When the Minčeta Tower was built in 1464, the builders did not have enough stones to complete the building. Everyone arriving from Gruž or Ploče was required to bring with them the heaviest stone they could carry to contribute to the project.

› Trsteno arboretum near Dubrovnik was founded in the 15th century and is the oldest arboretum in the world. Some of the plane trees are almost 400 years old.

Situated on a cliff above the Adriatic Sea, Villa Agave immerses you in an atmosphere of comfort, offering unobstructed views of the Dubrovnik Old Town and the majestic island of Lokrum.

Formerly the residence of the famous British archaeologist Sir Arthur Evans from 1875 to 1882, the villa was recently refurbished to the highest level of luxury. The contemporary Mediterranean style includes rustic wooden floors and timber ceiling beams. The villa is decorated with numerous eye-catching antique details, as well as artwork by esteemed Croatian artists. Highlights include a mural from 1970 by the famous local artist Milovan

Stanić which adorns the living room and interesting items from the owner's private collection such as an antique rocking horse from 1820 and a century-old handwoven carpet from Romania. Other details include custom-made furniture, a vintage chandelier and an open wooden staircase leading to the master bedroom. Spreading over 207 square metres, the villa includes a spacious living room with a fireplace, a dining room, three luxurious bedrooms, and a meditation room (of which two walls are believed to date from the 13th century St. Lazarus chapel).



The remainder of the original building dates from the 17th and 18th centuries. Guests are invited to observe and enjoy the building from the adjacent 400 square metres of gardens. The villa includes five terraces with sea views and an outdoor pool with an 'active swimming' mechanism. Villa Agave caters to the most discerning clientele and remains a haven for celebrities to this day. Legendary film director Francis Ford Coppola is only

The luxurious Villa Sheherezade is one of the most majestic seaside residences in the region. A masterpiece of Moorish architecture in white stone, topped with a striking turquoise dome, Villa Sheherezade is a palace in which legends have been born and epic romances played out. Legend claims that it was built in the early 1920's by a wealthy banker as a gesture of devotion to his beloved. True or not, the story of this palace by the sea is inextricably linked with romance – Elizabeth Taylor and Richard Burton stayed here while filming in Dubrovnik. Villa Sheherezade has continued to be a popular film location and has attracted such celebrity guests as tennis star John McEnroe.

THE LEGEND OF CAVTATS' NAME


In addition to a possible derivation from the Latin words *civitas vetus* (old city), the name of Cavtat is also associated with the legend of the beautiful Cavtislava, the daughter of the Epidaurian king Kordun and Queen Amrusa.

As Cavtislava was courted by many men, the king decided to give her hand to the suitor who was fastest in completing some great task – constructing a fortification around the town, building a great temple in the town, constructing an aqueduct, or bringing in a ship loaded with silk. The fastest was a rich local nobleman by the name of Vrsanin, who managed to be the first to bring a water system into the town.

According to legend, a festival was held on the day of the opening of the Epidaurian aqueduct. Cavtislava was to have the first taste of the water from a golden jar. Yet, before the first drops of water poured out, a big lizard leaped out of the jar and fell right into her lap. Princess Cavtislava's heart broke from shock and she died instantly of fright. Legend claims that the lizard had been secretly placed into the jar by a jealous suitor who could not fulfil the task that Cavtislava's father had set. In memory of Cavtislava, the town of Cavtat arose following an earthquake which destroyed the original town.

Discover the local culture of the Konavle region

Visit the picturesque region of Konavle and experience our local traditions and customs. Use this opportunity to buy a perfect souvenir - perhaps a hand-embroidered handbag or a cushion with applied embroidery from Konavle (known as 'konavoski vez'). Island of Mljet

Time magazine once named Mljet one of the ten most beautiful islands in the world. It is known as a home of Ulysses and legendary underwater explorer Jacques Cousteau loved exploring this area.

DIVE INTO HAPPINESS!

Follow the route of ancient Greek galleons, Ulysses and Jacques Cousteau into the purest waters of the Adriatic...

Do you remember Ulysses, the great mythical Greek hero and king of Ithaca? According to one of many legends, Ulysses, (known to some as Odysseus) was shipwrecked on the island of Mljet and lured by the nymph Calypso into a cave where he became her hostage.

Today, the island of Mljet is a forested paradise and national park, famous for its salt-water lakes. Known for its stories and legends, Mljet is the largest island of the Dubrovnik archipelago. It is often called a 'green island' because of its lush vegetation. Its beautiful beaches create an amazing contrast with steep rocks, caves and cliffs. The western part of the island was proclaimed the first

national park in the Adriatic in 1960 with a protected indigenous eco-system of the Adriatic coast. Walking across Mljet, you will experience this unique environment with its cliffs, rocks, bays, scattered islets and unique geological system of salt lakes. Beautiful rich forest, small unpaved roads, discrete pathways and the surface of the crystal-clear lakes enhance the tranquil feeling which Mljet radiates.

SALT LAKES AND THE NATIONAL PARK

Undoubtedly the most famous part of the island! These were freshwater lakes from their formation about 10,000 years ago until the beginning of Christian era. The natural secrets of Mljet's two lakes have attracted many scientists over the years, as well as innumerable nature lovers seeking pristine surroundings. To experience their beauty, people swim and sail across them in gondolas. In the middle of the Great Lake, a



small isle, called St. Mary, is home to an ancient Benedictine monastery and a small church dating to the 12th century. The small island bestows an exceptional aesthetic image to all of Mljet and is a favourite tourist destination.

HILLTOPS

It's no secret that a hilltop usually provides you with a very fine view of the surroundings. Add a stunning island to the mix and you will get nothing less than a breathtaking sight for your eyes! Although Mljet has a great variety of paths that lead you to as many hilltops as you can imagine, we recommend you the top three: Veliki Grad, Montokuc and Planjak.

ULYSSES' CAVE (JAMA)

An amazing spot located a short walk from Babino Polje. It is a marine cave that owes its denomination to an ancient legend according to which the adventurous Ulysses spent seven years on Mljet, enchanted by the beautiful nymph Calypso that lived right in this cave. Take a pleasant walk through the fields and try to see if you can resist its charm! It is also a very popular spot for high jumps, thanks to the rocky and slightly cliffy shoreline that surrounds the cave. While swimming, you will see the amazing water colors on your way in and out, what will surely make this an unforgettable experience!



ANCIENT VILLAGES

Most villages on Mljet were founded between the 15th and the 18th century. The houses were generally made of stones and have thus contributed to create a renowned typical Dalmatian-Mediterranean inspiring 'atmosphere' of ancient times, which still lives through many of the island's old settlements nowadays. Although abandoned in its majority, these houses and its close surroundings still witness about the traditional and hard-working daily lives of our ancestors. If you wish to take a break from your summer activities, get inspired by these storytelling walls that will take you back in time! Take a walk around Prožura, Korita, Maranovići (with some stunning views!) or the ancient part of Babino Polje (ask for Šehovići or Sršenovići).

TIP: Make sure you don't miss the Ethno Museum Biskup while strolling through Babino Polje.

BEACHES

Although Mljet offers numerous swimming spots and you can swim anywhere you want, including the Lakes there are actually only three beaches on the island. And surprisingly, the prettiest and the biggest of the three doesn't even get crowded! That is because it's a bit further and more complicated to reach than the other two. The name of this sandy beach is Uvala Blaca (or Limuni) and it's located at the far end of the island from the NP.



The only beach that has a bar and a supplies shop near is Saplunara. If you are going to Blaca or Vala, make sure you have your drinks and bites with you!

The second sandy beach is called Saplunara and is located quite close to Blaca but easily reachable by car and the first one you'll see, so most visitors ignore the existence of Blaca and just stay here. Uvala Sutmiholjska or Vala is a pebble beach located at around 4km from Babino Polje. Overall, Mljet's shore is generally rocky but that doesn't mean you can't have a decent swim. On the contrary, it will give you the opportunity to visit some real cool places that you might have missed otherwise.

DIVING

Diving around Mljet's is completely different from diving throughout the rest of Croatia. The great 20th century marine biologist and explorer Jacques Cousteau said that Mljet is one of the world's top ten most beautiful diving destinations. Mljet is located along an important maritime route, and many ancient Greek galleys sailed through the Adriatic.

Some of these ships sank, ran aground, or shipwrecked, leaving behind fascinating ruins, such as the famous amphorae, terra cotta containers used for transporting oil and wine.

According to Cousteau, the sea around Mljet is one of the purest in the world, making this area perfect for diving and exploring underwater life, numerous caves and fascinating Roman ruins.

Explore this underwater world and discover red coral, octopus or lobster, or simply enjoy searching for different kinds of shellfish. There are beautiful rock formations and caves, which you will find along your diving route. While diving, you might see some amphora or some other ancient artefacts.

However you choose to get to Mljet, you won't regret it, as the Green Island has something for everyone – beautiful walking and bicycle paths, hundreds of hidden swimming spots and many beaches to spend a relaxed sunny afternoon. And when Mljet overwhelms you, it is impossible to think of anything else...

The Island of Mljet is located just off the Dubrovnik coast. It belongs to a group of south Dalmatian islands. Hotels Odisej lies on the very north of the island, in Pomena bay, within the Mljet National Park. The island is accessible by ferry and speed boat lines from Dubrovnik, and Prapratno on Pelješac peninsula. The hotel provides a transfer service as well.

Konavle

Konavle's traditional folklore, incomparably preserved rural architecture, unique costumes and embroidery, and historic monuments are a true example of how man and nature complement each other.

If you are up to escaping Dubrovnik for a day ...

Konavle has for centuries been renowned for the production of silk thread, which was used for the decoration of men's and notably women's national costumes. Every woman of Konavle had to raise enough silkworms to produce her own yarn for her individual embroidery and for a long time, it would be her only accessory and identity card. This family tradition continues in the present time. If you are eager to explore the history of the Konavle region, be sure to visit the Illyrian necropolises - about 115 large stone funeral vessels in Mikulići, the Mithra sanctuaries in Močići, or the tombstones in Brotnice. Be sure to check out the impressive 15th century fort 'Sokol' built at the foot of the stone cliffs that rise above the village of Dunave in Konavle. It was the largest fort in the area, built to guard the border of the Dubrovnik Republic and defended the area from enemy invasions through the natural passage between the massive Snježnica and Bjelotina Mountains.

We also recommend visiting the Konavle County House museum that contains the ethnographic treasures of Konavle - about 500 items including men's and women's folk costumes, embroidery, jewellery, arms, musical instruments and items used in the everyday life.

If you want to explore the folklore and ethnography of Konavle, you must visit Čilipi, the cultural centre and one of the largest settlements in Konavle. For over forty years now, every Sunday morning at 11.15 am, from Easter to the end of October, traditional folk dancing is held in front of the St. Nicholas church. This is surely the best way to get to know the tradition and customs of this region.

Imagine a beach where there is no music, no bars, no cars, no crowds, no phone or internet signal, just pristine waters and the open sea in front of you. Sounds like a dream, right? Search for Pasjača beach which shyly emerges from the giant Konavle cliffs, close by to the village Popovići. It is not a natural beach; the sea worn down the surplus of stone left from the tunnels dug in World War Two creating a surreally beautiful beach.

DIRECTIONS: ... don't think so. You have to be persuasive enough to have the locals show you the way or persistent enough to google it yourself (remember no internet signal).

Make sure you reach the top of the fort as you will be impressed by the breath-taking view of the entire Konavle region.
