These established fields are the core of Edmonton's economy and are comprised of professionals, academics, innovators and visionaries that are ready to help you make an impact with your event.

HEALTH & LIFE SCIENCES

Edmonton is a medical research powerhouse, home to world-class medical facilities, established health companies and fine post-secondary institutions. This robust and well-connected ecosystem provides researchers and entrepreneurs with an ideal, strategic opportunity to innovate and experiment with new protocols, devices and procedures.

The University of Alberta is one of the leading academic health science centres in the world, internationally recognized for ground-breaking research across a wide variety of health disciplines including; cardiology, diabetes, oncology, virology and organ transplantation.

With rapid advancement in the field of core AI and Machine Learning Research, the University of Alberta's Department of Computer Science is working with our knowledge economy to propel Edmonton's health and life sciences ecosystem forward daily.

Alberta Health Services (AHS), is Canada's largest province wide health care system, headquartered in Edmonton. This fully integrated system is responsible for delivering health services to more than 4.3 million people living in Alberta.

AGRICULTURE & AGRI-FOOD PROCESSING

Alberta, with its vast plains and rich farmlands and famous beef, has a history rooted in agriculture and food production. With plenty of know-how and available space, Edmonton is a fertile environment that is well-suited for success in this industry. Alberta is the third largest overall crop producer (by GDP) and the second largest exporter of agricultural products in Canada. An abundance of talent, diverse business incubators and research facilities, and international access through established trades agreements and supply chain infrastructure provides a unique opportunity for growing and start-up businesses.

The majority of businesses within the agriculture and food sector in Edmonton fall within agriculture and inputs and food services.

Edmonton also excels within the food and beverage processing subsector, with many of its own local companies supplying retailers and food service providers across the country and beyond its borders. Some of the local companies include: Alley Kat Brewing Company, Champion Pet Foods, Inovata Foods, Progressive Foods, The Little Potato Company, Kitchen Partners, Sunrise Bakery, and Jacek Chocolate.

AGRI-FOOD DISCOVERY PLACE (AFDP)

The AFDP is the University of Alberta's pilot plant that is a world class innovative research, training, and technology transfer facility in the agriculture and food sector. AFDP supports five research platform technologies which include: Meat Safety & Processing (level 2 containment); Carcass & Meat Science; Natural Health Products & Functional Food; Animal Nutrient & Ingredient Development (including pet food formulation and extrusion); and fermentation for optimization and scale up of level 1 microorganism.

AGRIVALUE PROCESSING BUSINESS INCUBATOR (APBI)

The APBI is a multi-tenant facility that provides the infrastructure and services to support and enhance the establishment and growth of new companies and new business ventures in Alberta.



ICT & DIGITAL TECHNOLOGY

Embracing innovation and digital technology is essential in this modern world and Edmonton is a key opponent in the research and development of machine intelligence.

The University of Alberta is in the top 100 universities in the world and has been at the forefront of artificial intelligence and machine learning research for the past 25 years. Being named one of three of Canada's national AI hubs leading the Pan-Canadian AI Strategy, an initiative dedicated to AI/ML research, and bringing emerging technologies to the marketplace.

Edmonton has a very strong and supportive innovation and tech ecosystem that includes a reputable talent pipeline of academia and industry experts, government investment and support, and a diverse array of incubators and research facilities that all work in conjunction to sustain and excel this sector.

EDMONTON'S INNOVATION ECOSYSTEM



ENERGY & SUSTAINABILITY

Sustainability initiatives have become a large part of Edmonton's culture, with a long-term plan in place to make Edmonton a completely carbon neutral city by 2040. Prepared collectively with the support of Edmonton's academic, business, public institution and government communities, Climate Resilient Edmonton, is the city's adaptation and action plan directed at minimizing the exposure of people and assets to the impacts of climate change.

SUSTAINABLE INFRASTRUCTURE

Edmonton is devoted to carrying out this colossal change, by engraving social responsibility into the city's infrastructure and by encouraging people to behave in a socially responsible manner by reducing their carbon footprint.

SOURCES OF ENERGY

1. Oil & Gas is not considered the most sustainable form of energy, but petroleum products are still dominant in the global market and essential for meeting global energy demand. Alberta has the world's third largest proven oil reserve, contributing to over 80% of Canada's total oil production, so it is crucial for the development and investment in innovative technologies, to ensure the responsible management of our resources in an environmentally sustainable manner, producing less greenhouse gas emissions.
2. Solar energy is one of the most common sources of alternative energy. Edmonton is one of the sunniest cities in Canada with an average of 2,300 hours of sunlight per year, making it the ideal location for harvesting energy through integrated solar cell installations on new and existing infrastructure.
3. District Energy Sharing Systems distribute heating and cooling to multiple buildings in an area, such as an entire neighborhood, from a single centralized low-carbon energy source. Wind Energy is an alternative source of renewable energy. The province of Alberta plans to add up to 5,000-MW of renewable energy through private sector investment (\$10 billion) by 2030.
4. One of the winning bids accepted, was Edmonton based Capital Power, for a 201-MW project in Southern Alberta.



EDMONTON'S FOCUS ON SUSTAINABILITY

Edmonton is working towards becoming a carbon neutral city and is committed to guiding its planning and investment decisions through its 'Climate Resilience Edmonton' adaptation strategy and action plan.

Blatchford Project

Blatchford is a community that will transform how people connect with each other, with their city and with the environment. This is one of the largest sustainable development projects in the world, transforming 536 acres of land (Edmonton's former municipal airport) in the heart of Edmonton.

Expected to house over 30,000 residents, the site will be made up of two residential spaces, east and west, divided by a town centre boasting an 80-acre park. Powered entirely by solar and renewable energy sources, like geexchange and sewer heat exchange that will tie into a high efficiency energy delivery system that replaces traditional furnaces, air conditioners, and boilers in buildings. This centralized [District Energy Sharing System](#) will distribute and share heating and cooling energy between buildings throughout the entire neighborhood.

Edmonton International Airport (EIA)

Sustainability is one of EIA's core values. This includes being responsible stewards to the natural environment while meeting the Edmonton region's growing need for air service.

- EIA is LEED* Gold Certified for its new terminal and its Central Tower.
- With the support of EIA, Air Canada has operated eight biofuel Airbus flights from Edmonton to San Francisco since 2012. Reducing carbon emissions by over 10 tonnes and representing a 20% reduction in net carbon emissions for every flight, advocating the development of Canadian biofuel to become commercially viable and creating a more sustainable aviation industry.
- Absolute Combustion International and Edmonton International Airport have successfully completed a three-year test to commercialize a faster and more efficient portable diesel aircraft heater that can operate at temperatures as low as -50C. This can bring the cabin of a Boeing 737 from -30C to +20C in half an hour, with a 50-70% reduction in diesel fuel usage and zero carbon monoxide emissions.



SUSTAINABLE MEETINGS AT THE EDMONTON CONVENTION CENTRE

The Edmonton Convention Centre is one of only five Canadian venues to be certified to ASTM standards and was the first conference venue in Canada to receive Green Key level five certification. The venue is also a certified Climate Smart business.

Interested in greening your next meeting? The Edmonton Convention Centre's Responsible Events Program was created in response to a growing demand by event planners and attendees to have more environmentally responsible solutions in the meetings and events industries. With the goal of integrating sustainability into every planning conversation, the Responsible Events Program provides value for clients who select plant-based menu options, reduce single-use items, opt-in to donation programs, purchase carbon offsets and participate in post-event reporting.

- Hundreds of tropical plants and a sustainable living wall inside the facility absorb 4,120 lbs of Co2 each year.
- Rooftop gardens, urban beekeeping, and the use of solar energy and permaculture help offset urban "heat island" effects.
- The building is built into the side of the river valley, improving insulation and increasing the building's energy efficiency.
- Hydration refill stations that track the number of bottles diverted from landfills with each refill.
- Fresh fruits, vegetables and herbs grown on rooftop gardens are used in menus prepared at the ECC, reducing food and transportation costs.
- Onsite composting and recycling programs reduce food and packaging waste
- Donation of surplus food to local agencies, further reduce food waste.
- Responsible Meetings pre-planning toolkit guides the planning process in terms of sustainability goals.
- Currently undergoing a \$10.8 million project including the replacement of 696 sloped glass panels, which is currently the largest photovoltaic glass installation in Canada and is expected to be completed by summer 2020.



ADVANCED MANUFACTURING

Machine manufacturing represents over 15% of Edmonton's overall manufacturing sector with approximately 274 companies working in the industry in the Edmonton metropolitan area.

Edmonton's manufacturing strengths include industrial and mining machinery, metal fabrication, construction materials, nanotechnology and microelectromechanical systems, and petrochemical products.

NANO AND MICRO-ELECTROMECHANICAL SYSTEMS (MEMS) TECHNOLOGY

Within this complex system of manufacturing, Edmonton has facilities and a network to support growth in research and development for Nano & Microelectromechanical Systems (MEMS) technology and the commercialization of these technologies. These include: Alberta Centre for Advanced Microsystems and Nanotechnology Products (ACAMP), NanoFAB Centre and the National Institute for Nanotechnology (NINT).

AN ENGINEERING CITY

Out of Canada's major cities, Edmonton has the second most skilled trades people in Canada (per population) and the most engineers in Canada (per population), making for the best labour force for the advanced manufacturing sector.



EDUCATION

With over 180,000 part-time and full-time students attending Edmonton's six publicly funded post-secondary institutions, Edmonton is a hotbed of education. With institutions like the University of Alberta and NAIT, known globally for their research.

THE UNIVERSITY OF ALBERTA

The University of Alberta is one of Canada's leading research universities, hosting more than 500 graduate programs, 200 undergraduate programs, and attracting more than \$500 million annually in external research funding. With 18 faculties across 5 campuses and dozens of research centres, the university is internationally recognized for ground-breaking research across a wide variety of health disciplines.

INDIGENOUS & RELIGIOUS

More than one sixth of Canada's Indigenous population live in the province of Alberta. Edmonton resides on Treaty 6 Territory and is home to 76,000 of those who identify themselves as either First Nations, Inuit or Métis.

The religious sector in Edmonton is quite significant with 69% of the population affiliated with a religion. These include Christian, Muslim, Sikh, Buddhist, Hindu, Jewish and Traditional Indigenous Spirituality; the largest of which is Christian at nearly 60%.

With such a large proportion of Edmonton being indigenous or religious, this sector has become a high priority and with large city support, Edmonton is making it a priority to empower this large community through education, entrepreneurship and financial support.

THE EDMONTON CONVENTION CENTRE

Located in the heart of downtown with easy access to Light Rail Transit (LRT), shops, restaurants and 3,000+ guestrooms. Your guests' unique experience starts as soon as they step foot into the venue, travelling through the glass atrium that not only overlooks North America's largest urban parkland, but also showcases Edmonton's commitment to sustainability.

Functional Space

The Edmonton Convention Centre offers over 150,000 ft² of flexible and creative space that can host any type of event, conference or convention imaginable. With a variety of rooms, this venue can host anything from a small or large meeting on the Meeting Level, a concert or tradeshow on the Assembly Level, or a formal gala event in Hall D.

A Culinary Experience to Remember

You will discover the expertise, variety and delicious surprises catered by an award-winning in-house, team led by 2012 Canadian Chef of the Year Serge Belair. With 11 Red Seal chefs delivering an authentic farm to table experience, and sourcing heavily from local producers and community growers, you can customize any meal to feed your body and soul, whether it's dinner for 5 or 5,000. ECC recently launched its brand-new [Plant-Based menu](#), taking food sustainability to the next level. This option will allow you to offer your delegates well balanced meals that are both nutritious and delicious.

Sustainable Meetings and Permaculture

In alignment with city priorities for social, environmental, and economic sustainability, the Edmonton Convention Centre highlights Edmonton's commitment to sustainability throughout its operations. The ECC contributes to our city's urban biodiversity, featuring an enormous atrium filled with diverse tropical plants, an

indigenous medicine wheel garden, a herb and vegetable garden - pollinated by their very own urban beehive- and a monarch butterfly preservation garden. The facility is ASTM certified and is the first conference centre in Canada to receive Green Key level five status.

Responsible Meetings Program

The new [Responsible Meetings Program](#) was created in response to growing demand for more environmentally responsible solutions in the meetings & events industry. With the goal of integrating sustainability into every planning conversation and providing additional incentives to make the sustainable choice financially viable.

Urban Beekeeping Program

As part of the City of Edmonton's urban beekeeping program, the ECC hopes to grow its current hive with 8,000 bees to approximately 70,000 bees, allowing the honey harvest to be included within culinary operations.

Atrium Modernization Project

The ECC has recently undergone a \$10.8 million atrium modernization project that was completed in May 2020. The project includes the replacement of all 696 sloped glass panels with photovoltaic (solar cell) glass units that will convert sunlight into clean electricity. It is estimated that more than 227,000 kilowatt hours of electricity will be generated each year and the panels will reduce anticipated greenhouse gases by over 150,000 kg.

THE EDMONTON EXPO CENTRE

The Edmonton EXPO Centre is the largest meeting venue West of Toronto, boasting 522,000 square feet of flexible meting space to choose from when planning your conference or convention.
