


The Bedrooms



The Ballroom

The 272 sq. m. ballroom features floor-to-ceiling windows, wood-panelled walls and high ceilings, giving the room a plush yet airy feel. The history and former glory of University Arms is celebrated as the original stained glass windows, elegant and oversized fireplace and the sprung dance floor has been incorporated into the new space. It is designed for parties, weddings and large events, seating 180 guests or up to 200 standing. The room can be sectioned off into two so it is ideal for events of varying sizes.

The ballroom foyer is private and cosy. It is an ideal location for a pre-function reception or registration.
