HBO's epic TV series Game of Thrones® (GoT) was filmed all over Northern Ireland, with its stunning landscape and historic buildings becoming the fictional settings of Winterfell, Dragonstone and The Iron Islands, among others.

In reality, Castle Ward was the 18th century home of the Ward family. But for the first two seasons of GoT, its farmvard became Winterfell, home of the Starks, You can also find the Whispering Wood nearby where Robb Stark's army ambushed Jamie Lannister's, as well as visit the 'penultimate very first episode' location scene where young Bran Stark was pushed out the Castle window. You can even dress like a member of the Starks for a tour of the grounds and test your archery skills in the same courtvard used by the Stark children in the first series.

Giant's Causeway is one of the most iconic sights in Northern Ireland and the country's only Unesco World Heritage Site. It's an area of about 40,000 interlocking basalt



columns, formed by ancient volcanic eruptions. Local storytelling guides will regale you with the legend of brawling giants, Finn McCool and Benandonner, who built this causeway. Together, you take the slow road to a sheltered and secluded spot among the majestic basalt columns. Here you can sit and enjoy the waves and the views. It's a fitting place to toast famous giants with a 12-year-old malt, only available from Old Bushmills Distillery, just a stone's throw away. It will be a whisky on the rocks experience you won't forget.

As you walk along and beside the walls your guides will highlight key events and tell you stories going back hundreds of years. They reveal what important events, such as the Plantation, the Siege, Emigration and the Troubles, that changed Irish, British and European history, meant for Derry-Londonderry's people and reflect on their present-day legacy.

The city's compact nature means venues like City Hotel (meeting space for up to 300 delegates) the Playhouse (meeting space for up to 180 delegates), the historic St Columb's Hall (330 capacity for banqueting) and Guildhall (220 for banqueting) are all within a five-minute walk of each other.

The best way to see the Fermanagh Lakelands is from the water, so hop in a boat (ernewatertaxi.com) and explore the many islands of Lough Erne. And if that boat is skippered by Barry Flanagan, you will see and hear some fantastic stories.

Starting from Enniskillen, Ireland's only island town, Barry will choose your route, based on his knowledge of the Lough Erne's changing currents, seasons and



movements of wildlife. On Devenish Island you can experience the peace of the sixth century monastery.

For event space, the four-star Manor House Country Hotel has a range of boardrooms and suites for meetings, or the Fermanagh Lakeland Forum can host up to 900 delegates for a conference.

Explore 100 acres of stunning gardens at Northern Ireland's only royal residence. Marvel at the beautiful rooms and glorious gardens and get an intimate glimpse behind the scenes into the personal living quarters of a working royal household. Many of the crucial talks that led to the Good Friday Agreement took place here.

The Castle's illustrious history and picturesque surroundings make it a perfect backdrop for corporate events, from intimate board meetings and workshops to award shows.

You can hold a meeting for 18 VIPs in the Privy Council Chamber or a reception for up to 120 in the Throne Room. Further event spaces include the Red Room and State Dining Room, host to countless world leaders.

You can even hold a baby lamb (at
the right time of year).

But it's his relationship with his dogs that is most striking. Seeing them up close, working together, communicating via body language, whispers and whistles, is amazing.

The farm has very welcoming three-bedroom onsite accommodation at Glenshane Country House. If you need more rooms, make it a day trip from Belfast or Derry-Londonderry. Both cities are less than 50 minutes from the farm.

Take a leisurely stroll through the Walled Garden filled with beautiful colour throughout the seasons before trying the local cuisine including the Glenarm Shorthorn Beef and Salmon.

Glenarm Castle is the perfect venue for any number of corporate activities; from executive lunches and dinners to product launches to team-building activity days and corporate meetings. Team-building activities could include clay pigeon shooting, fishing or archery.

Rademon Estate Distillery's first spirit, Shortcross Gin, was released in April 2014 and is inspired by its surroundings of lush gardens and



forest fauna. Gin experts will take you on a guided tour, where you'll learn all about foraged botanicals, and the distillery's unique gin and whiskey-making processes. After which, you'll get to enjoy a tasting of the handcrafted, award-winning gin next to three beautiful copper pot stills (pictured). The distillery's visitor centre is also available for corporate and private events.



orthern Ireland has a rich history of writers and poets, as well as some of the biggest names in Hollywood movies.



MUSIC

Music is an important part of Northern Ireland's cultural history.

Belfast-born *George Ivan Morrison*, better known as Van
Morrison, sang about a Brown Eyed
Girl in 1967 and it became his bestknown song. It's one of three songs
included in the Rock and Roll Hall
of Fame's '500 Songs That Shaped
Rock and Roll', along with Madame
George and Moondance.

In 1977 The Undertones burst

onto the music scene with their debut single Teenage Kicks. They went on to become one of the most successful bands in Northern Ireland.

Gary Lightbody is the lead singer of Snow Patrol (see main picture above). Their 2002 album Final Straw went five times Platinum in the UK and featured the hit song Run.

Hannah Peel is a musician and composer who has scored music for the documentary Game of Thrones®: The Last Watch. She has released five solo albums and two with her band The Magnetic North.

David Holmes, DJ and composer, has written film scores for major Hollywood productions such as the Oceans trilogy of films, directed by Steven Soderbergh.



ACTORS

Liam Neeson is well known from the hit Taken films but first rose to prominence

in 1993's Steven Spielberg film Schindler's List, Oscar nominated for Best Actor.

Multiple award-winning actor, writer and director *Kenneth Brannagh* was born in Belfast and has directed a film named after the city, due to be released in 2021. Its cast includes *Jamie Dornan* and *Dame Judi Dench*.

Bronagh Gallagher made her name on screen with small parts in some very big films, including Pulp Fiction and Star Wars: Episode 1, as well as a more prominent role in 1991's The Commitments.

Jamie Dornan was an awardwinning villain in TV's The Fall before playing billionaire Christian Grey in the Fifty Shades films.

For 10 wildly successful years, the world's most popular TV show, Game of

Thrones®, called Northern Ireland its home. The legendary, Emmy Award-winning series owes its success in no small part to the jawdropping scenery of the numerous filming locations scattered across the country.

Two recent, but very different, examples of successful TV shows

filmed and set in Northern Ireland are Derry Girls and The Fall. Both Derry Girls and The Fall have been nominated for and won a host of television awards.

BBC BAFTA-nominated hit crime drama Line of Duty has also been filmed in Belfast and other locations throughout Northern Ireland since its second series.



LITERARY

Seamus Heaney
was a poet and
playwright who
received the Nobel

Prize for Literature in 1995. One of his best-known poems is Death of a Naturalist, is about how the reality of the world does not always match our expectations of it.

John Hewitt was a poet and contemporary of Seamus Heaney. He worked for the Belfast Museum and Art Gallery for 29 years. When he died in 1987 he donated his body to Queen's University Belfast for research.

CS Lewis is best known as the author of the Chronicles of Narnia, which have been recreated on stage, TV, film and radio many times over (see right for his statue in Belfast).





SPORT

While football is probably Northern Ireland's most popular sport (thanks

George Best! pictured below far right) it's golf that has produced some of the most notable sporting successes of recent times.

Rory McIlroy, from County Down's Holywood (pictured below middle) is one of the most successful golfers of the last decade. He spent 100 weeks at number one in the PGA rankings from March 2012 and is one of three players to win four majors by the age of 25, along with Tiger Woods and Jack Nicklaus. Other golfing successes include Darren Clarke, a veteran of the PGA Tour and winner of the Open Championship in 2011, as well as

Graeme McDowell, winner of the 2010 US Open.

Boxer Carl Frampton won the World Featherweight title in 2016. becoming the first fighter from Northern Ireland to win world titles in two weight classes.

Motorcycle racer Jonathan Rea has won the Superbike World Championship six times in a row from 2015 to 2020 and has the most race wins in the Superbike Championship.

Jockev Brian Hughes won the British jump racing Champion Jockev title for the 2019-20 season after riding 141 winners. Brendan Rodgers became manager of Premier League side Leicester after winning the domestic league and cup treble twice in charge of Celtic in Scotland. Northern Ireland also hosted the Giro d'Italia's opening stage in 2014.
