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JORDAN

Aqaba has a much more exclusive feel than the Egyptian Red Sea and is located only 140 km from Petra, the 7th world wonder, and 60 km from Wadi Rum, the most picturesque desert in the world.

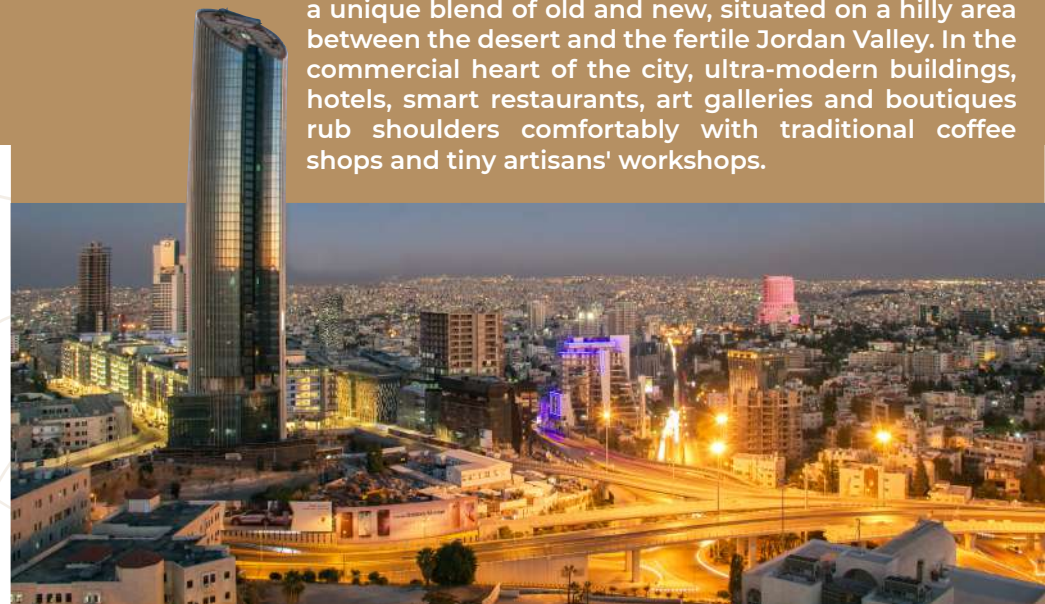
Jordan also boasts Roman sites, such as the best preserved Graeco-Roman city in the world, Jerash, where you can still experience life as it was 2000 years ago, thanks to the Roman Army and Chariot Experience (RACE); a Roman show that can be organized exclusively for incentives (the choreography of the fighting scenes and uniforms are all historically correct- the organizers used the same firm who advised the Hollywood blockbuster, Gladiator).

What makes this destination even more suitable is its stability, the genuine friendliness of its people, and the fact that its currency is pegged to the US dollar, which makes it excellent value for money.

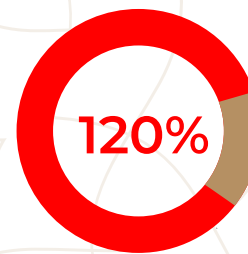
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AMMAN

JERASH

The closest to Petra on the list of favorite destinations in Jordan, the ancient city of Jerash boasts an unbroken chain of human occupation dating back more than



The city's golden age came under Roman rule and the site is now generally acknowledged to be one of the best-preserved Roman provincial towns in the world. Jerash also preserves a subtle blend of east and west. Its architecture, religion and languages reflect a process by which two powerful cultures meshed and coexisted – The Graeco-Roman world of the Mediterranean basin and the ancient traditions of the Arab Orient.



Ancient Amphitheatre

As you enter the South Theatre through a wooden door between the arches, there's little to suggest the treasure encased by the plain exterior. But then you emerge into the upper seating area... Built between AD 81 and 96 and once housing 5000 spectators in its two stories of seating. The theatre comes into its own during the Jerash Festival of Culture & Arts, when it proves as worthy a venue today as it was for the ancients 2000 years ago.



Jerash Hippodrome

This massive arena was 245m long and 52m wide and could seat 15,000 spectators at a time for chariot races and other sports. It is now also possible to relive the days when gladiators and charioteers appeared before the crowds, with regular re-enactments by the Roman Army and Chariot Experience (RACE).



Jerash Forum

Whatever the light and whatever the weather, the forum, with its organ-pipe columns arranged around an unusual oval-shaped plaza, is always breathtaking. It's one of Jerash undisputed highlights. This immense space lies in the heart of the city, linking the main thoroughfare (the cardo maximus) with the Temple of Zeus. It served as a marketplace and the main locus of the city's social and political life.



The show contains three parts:

- 1 A performance of twenty-four fully equipped legionaries showing their battle formations and tactics. The narrative explains the history of the Roman Army and how the legionaries lived and fought and about their traditions and customs.
- 2 The second part shows gruesome gladiator fights.
- 3 The last part is a race with several two horse chariots competing with up to seven laps around the "spina", middle barrier. RACE also makes custom made shows for weddings, birthdays, company conferences and similar.

Roman Army & Chariot Experience

RACE is the biggest regular show of any kind in the Middle East and the only large scale Roman re-enactment performance in the world.



Temple of Artemes

Dedicated to Artemis, the goddess of hunting and fertility and the daughter of Zeus and Leto, this temple was built between AD 150 and 170, and flanked by 12 elaborately carved Corinthian columns (11 still stand).

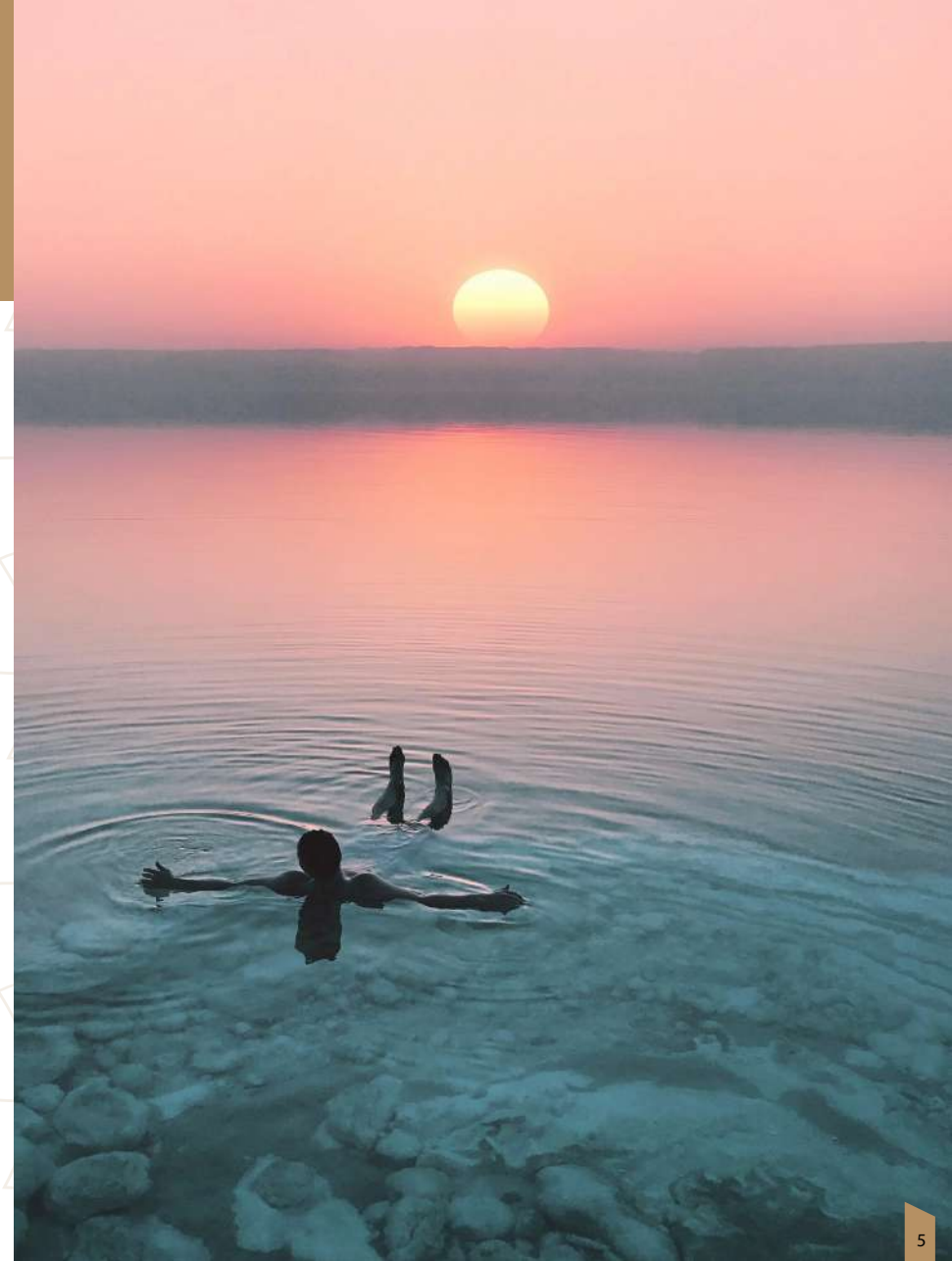


DEAD SEA

The lowest point on earth

is a spectacular natural wonder with its mix of beach living and religious history you can soak up the sun while Biblical scholars can get their daily dose of religious history. The leading attraction at the Dead Sea is the warm, soothing, super salty water itself – some ten times saltier than sea water, and rich in chloride salts of magnesium, sodium, potassium, bromine and several others.

The unusually warm, incredibly buoyant and mineral-rich waters have attracted visitors since ancient times, including King Herod the Great and the beautiful Egyptian Queen, Cleopatra. All of whom have luxuriated in the Dead Sea's rich, black, stimulating mud and floated effortlessly on their backs while soaking up the water's healthy minerals along with the gently diffused rays of the Jordanian sun.

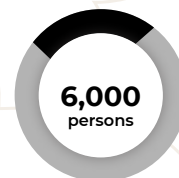

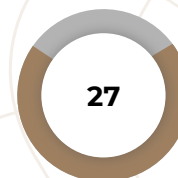

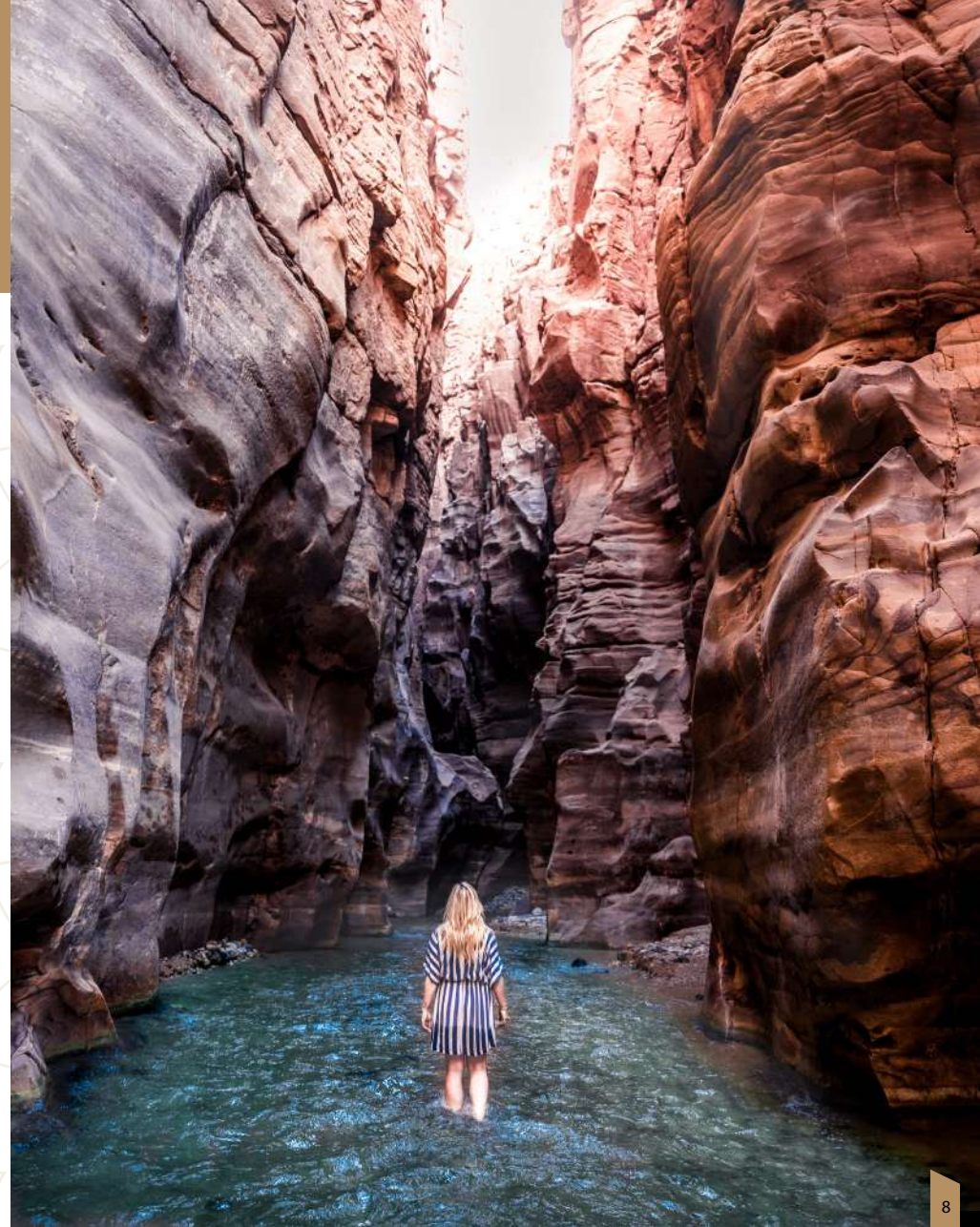

WADI MUJIB

The Mujib Biosphere Reserve is the lowest nature reserve in the world, with a spectacular array of scenery near the east coast of the Dead Sea.

The Reserve is located within the deep Wadi Mujib gorge, which enters the Dead Sea at 410m below sea level.

Over 300 species of plants, 10 species of carnivores and numerous species of permanent and migratory birds have been recorded. Mujib's sandstone cliffs are an ideal habitat for one of the most beautiful mountain goats in the world, the horned Ibex.



Team Hiking

Add some outdoor adventure to your stay in the Dead Sea with Wadi Mujib private hiking experience. Follow the Siq trail through the gorge, walking along shady paths, through river shallows and pools, and relaxing or swimming at the waterfall pool.



Don't Miss a Walk on the Wet Side

Adventurous Canyoning

Ibex Dry Winter Trails

Bethany Beyond Jordan

The Baptism Site

The site of John the Baptist's settlement at Bethany Beyond the Jordan, where Jesus was baptized, has long been known from the Bible (John 1:28 and 10:40) and from the Byzantine and medieval texts.

The site has now been identified on the east bank of the Jordan River, in the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan.

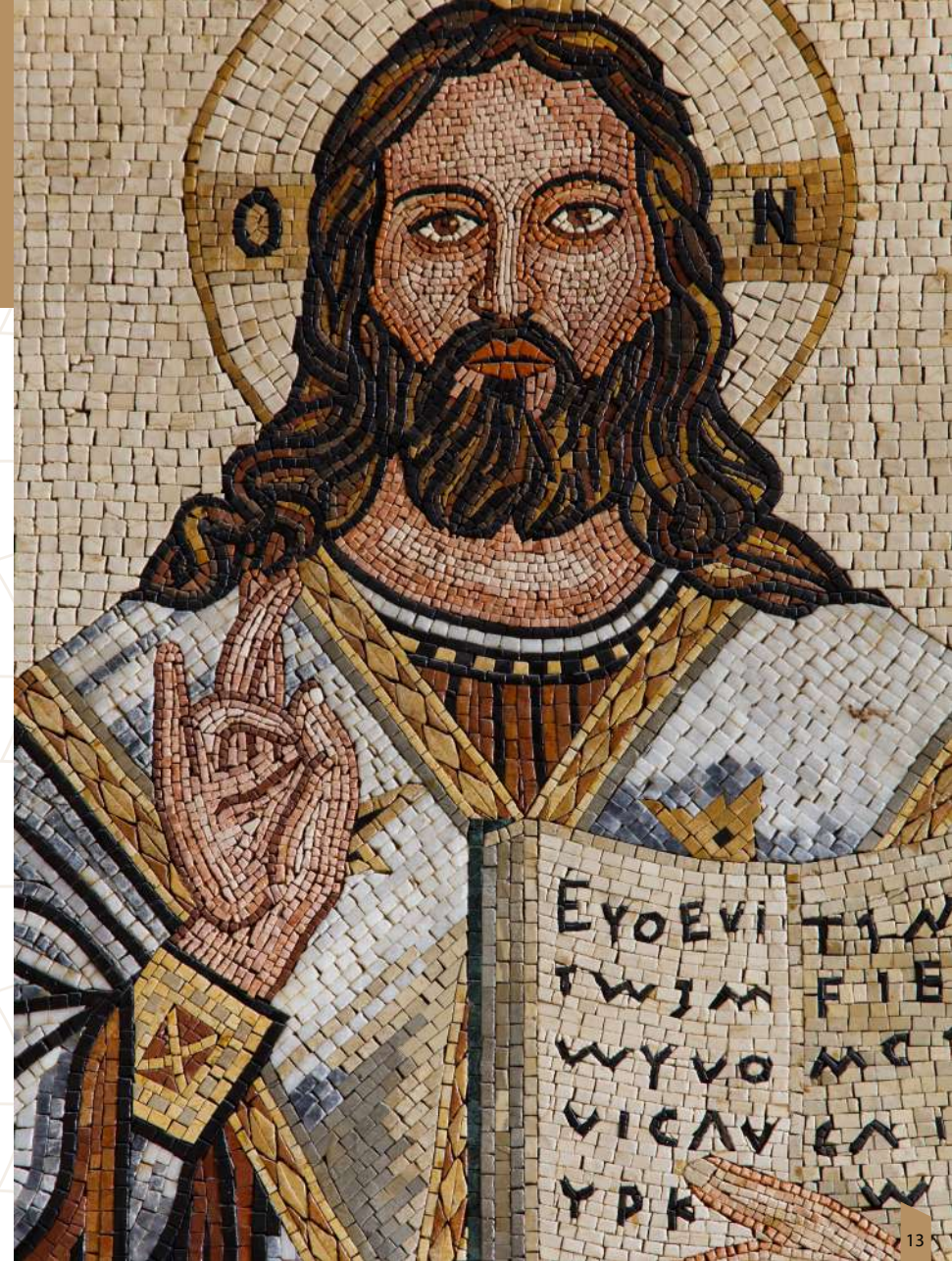


MADABA

The City of Mosaics

The city, best known for its spectacular Byzantine and Umayyad mosaics, is home to the famous 6th century mosaic map of Jerusalem and the Holy Land.

Some careful restoration and excavation in the early 1990s led to the creation of this open-air museum, which houses a collection of ruins and fine mosaics from the Madaba area. The Church of the Virgin Mary is also included in the site

An exciting journey through history you can experience at La Storia Tourism Complex where you can see at its large exhibition the religious, historical and cultural heritage of Jordan and the region



Art Craft Activities with the Locals

Jordan has many beautiful and interesting handicraft traditions that reflect its unique culture and history. Handicrafts made in Jordan are varied and include woven rugs, mouth blown glass, painted glass, jewelry, silver, earthenware ceramics, embroidery, mosaics, basketry, and carved wood products. These traditional crafts are representative of Jordan's diverse cultural heritage.



Archaeological Park II

Walkways lead around the ruins of this late-6th-century luxury private mansion, destroyed by fire and earthquake around 749. Look out for the continuation of the ancient Roman road that runs through what is now the Archaeological Park, as well as the 6th-century Martyrs Church, which was destroyed in the 8th century.



Madaba Museum

Housed in several old Madaba residences, this museum features a 6th-century mosaic depicting a naked satyr; a saucy (and partly damaged) mosaic of Ariadne dancing with cymbals on her hands and feet; and a mosaic in the courtyard depicting two rams tied to a tree – a popular image recalling Abraham's sacrifice.



Madaba Institute for Mosaic Art & Restoration

Originally set up as a school in 1992 by the Jordanian government, this institute trains Jordanian artists in the production and restoration of mosaics, spreads awareness of mosaics in Jordan and actively preserves mosaics throughout the country.



Carpet City

Be warned: it's notoriously difficult to leave a carpet shop in Jordan empty-handed. This is partly due to the skill of the salesmen and partly because the rugs are so desirable.

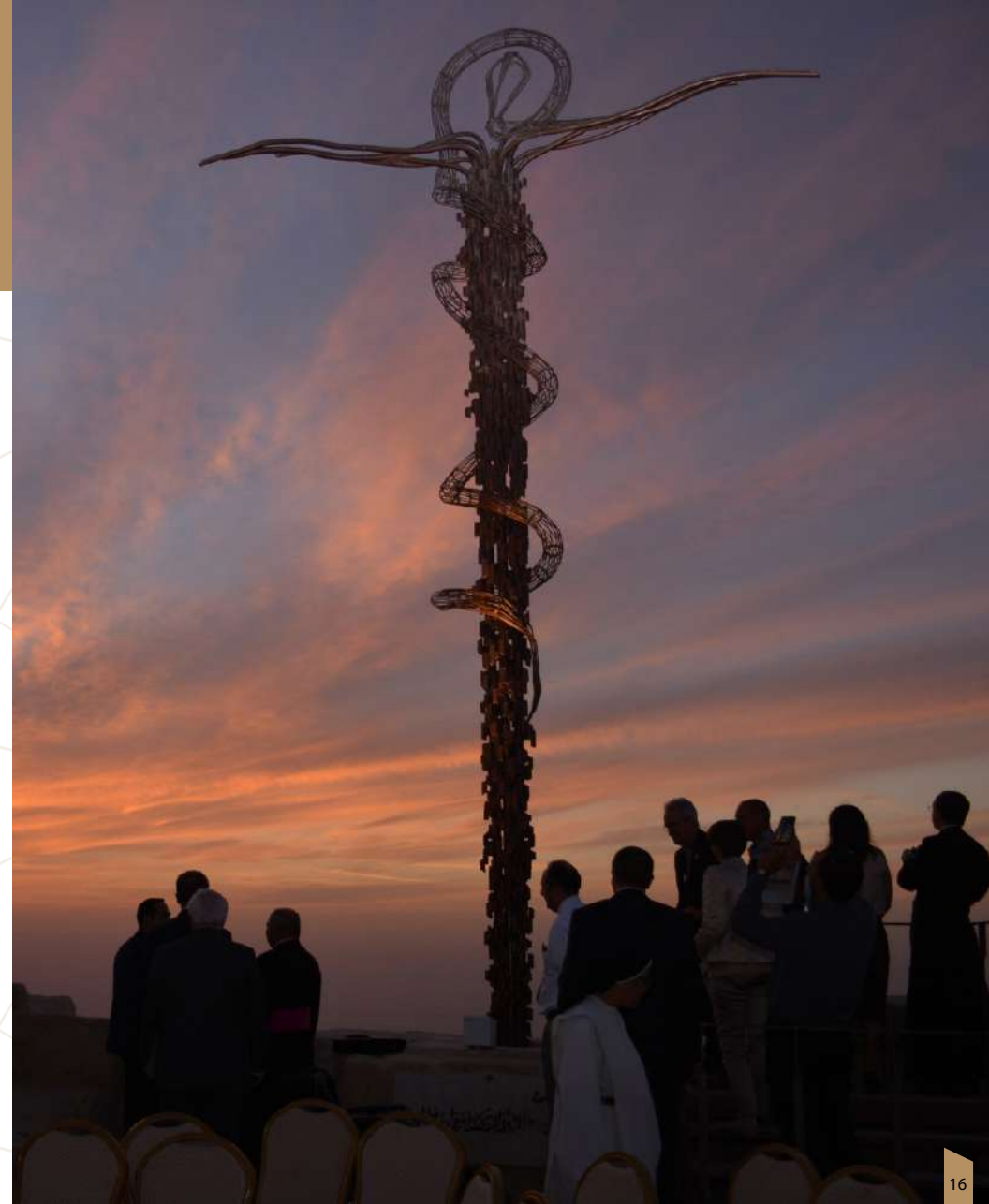


MOUNT NEBO

From Mount Nebo's windswept promontory overlooking the Dead Sea, the Jordan River Valley, Jericho and the distant hills of Jerusalem, Moses viewed the Holy Land of Canaan that he would never enter.

He died and was buried in Moab. Mount Nebo became a place of pilgrimage for early Christians from Jerusalem and a small church was built there in the 4th century to commemorate the end of Moses' life.

The Serpentine Cross, which stands just outside the sanctuary, is symbolic of the bronze (or brazen) serpent taken by Moses into the desert and the cross upon which Jesus was crucified.



PETRA

The Red Rose City

The ancient city of Petra is one of Jordan's national treasures and by far its best known tourist attraction.

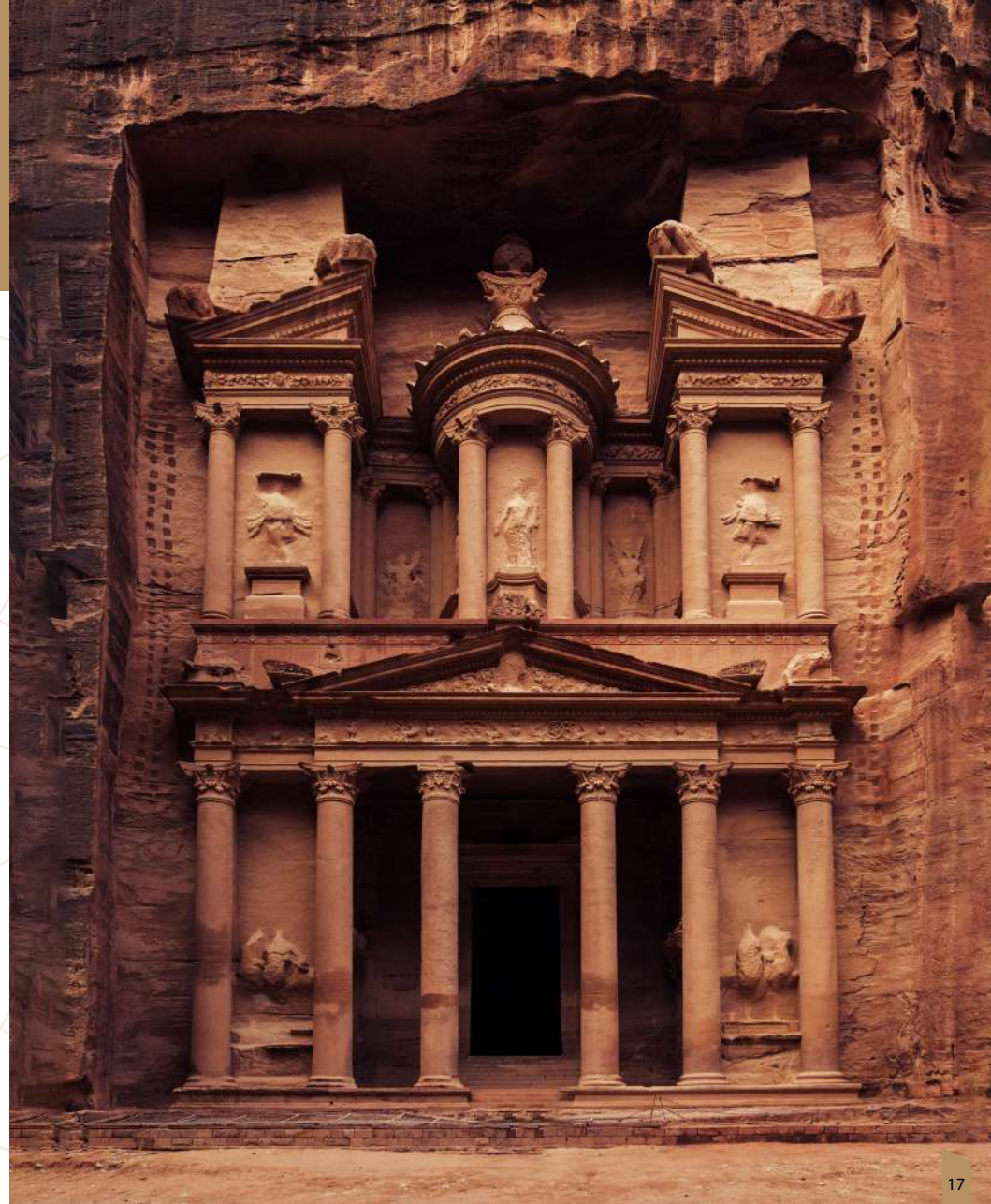
Petra is the legacy of the Nabataeans, an industrious Arab people who settled in southern Jordan more than



Admired then for its refined culture, massive architecture and ingenious complex of dams and water channels, Petra is a UNESCO World Heritages Site and one of the new Seven Wonders of the World.

Inhabited by the Nabateans, Edomite's and Romans, Petra brought together the knowledge and skill of these civilizations to create this world wonder.

Caravans laden with incense, silks, spices and other exotic goods would rest at Petra.



The Siq

It is the ancient main entrance leading to the city of Petra, starts at the Dam and ends at the opposite side of the vault, a split rock with a length of about 1200m and a width of 3 to 12m, and height up to about 80m; most of the rock is natural and another part was sculptured by the Nabataeans. The Siq, the main road that leads to the city, starts from the Dam and ends at the Treasury.



The Treasury

The siq opens up onto Petra's most magnificent façade; the Treasury, or Al Khazna. It is almost 40 meters high and intricately decorated with Corinthian capitals, friezes, figures and more. The Treasury is crowned by a funerary urn, which according to local legend conceals a pharaoh's treasure.



Street of Facades

It is a name given to the row of monumental Nabataean tombs carved in the southern cliff face that lies past the Treasury and adjacent to the outer Siq., that when you pass the Treasury, the Siq begins to widen gradually as it reaches into an open area. On both sides, there are a number of Nabataean burial interfaces decorated with grindstones along with other decorations



The Royal Tombs

During any trip to Petra, you can't miss the unpredictable Royal Tombs that took its name from the rich decoration. To reach them you have to climb a stairway that leads to the famous Urn Tomb. Beside the Urn Tomb is a small tomb known as the Silk Tomb. This name comes from the rich color of the sandstone. Then come next the Palace Tomb, the Corinthian Tomb and the Tomb of Sesto Fiorentino.



The Colonnaded Street

The street represents an original Nabataean creation, later refurbished during the period of Roman occupation. It would have been one of the principal shopping streets of ancient Petra. The street was rebuilt in 106 BC with a width of 6 meters.



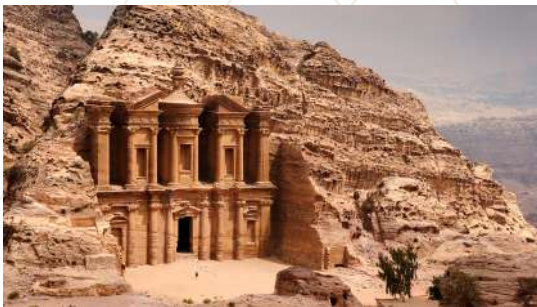
The Great Temple

The "Great" Temple Complex represents one of the major archaeological and architectural components of central Petra.



The Monastery

It is one of the largest monuments in Petra, measuring 47m wide by 48.3m high. It was built on the model of the Khazna but here the bas-reliefs are replaced by niches to house sculptures. A columned portico extends of the façade; the interior is occupied by two side benches and altar against the rear wall. It was used as a biclinium for the meetings of religious associations.



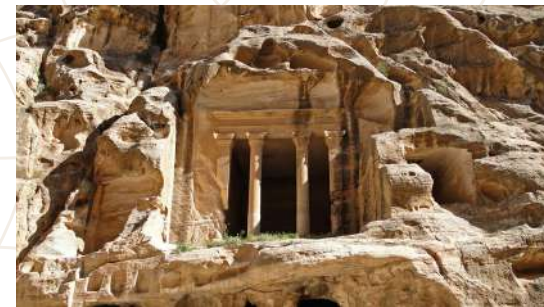
Petra by Night

Complete your Petra experience with a visit of Petra Night Show, this event is a magical way to see part of the rock city by candlelight and explore the old city, which has become a world wonder, incomparable experience starts by walking the entire Siq to the Treasury, lit with over 1,500 candles to bring the major attraction due to the spectacular view it has.



Little Petra

A ten-minute drive north of Petra is Siq Al-Barid, which is also referred to as 'Little Petra' due to similarities with the main site. It is thought to have been an important suburb of Petra and is entered through a narrow opening, similar to Siq but of a much smaller scale. The site includes tombs, temples, water channels and cisterns carved out of the rock as well as the remains of frescoes on plaster.



Themed Gala Dinners at Little Petra

Little Petra is an ideal location for holding business meetings or gala dinners. Its history as one of the greatest commercial capitals in the ancient world is nothing short of inspirational. Mountain View Bedouin Nights

Under a tent richly decorated with the trappings of Bedouin pride, guests will be main characters of a genuine reenactment of the traditional Bedouin welcome ['Ahlan wa Sahlan'] coffee ceremony performed by authentically Bedouin tribesmen clad in their specific attire and wearing red and white kuffie. Guests will be invited to sit on mattresses at low tables and enjoy a royal banquet and entertainment fit for Sheikhs. There's plenty of music, dancing and Bedouin fare, fireworks splitting the pure, crisp desert air complemented by a camel or two bedecked in regal ornaments, sedately surveying the scene.

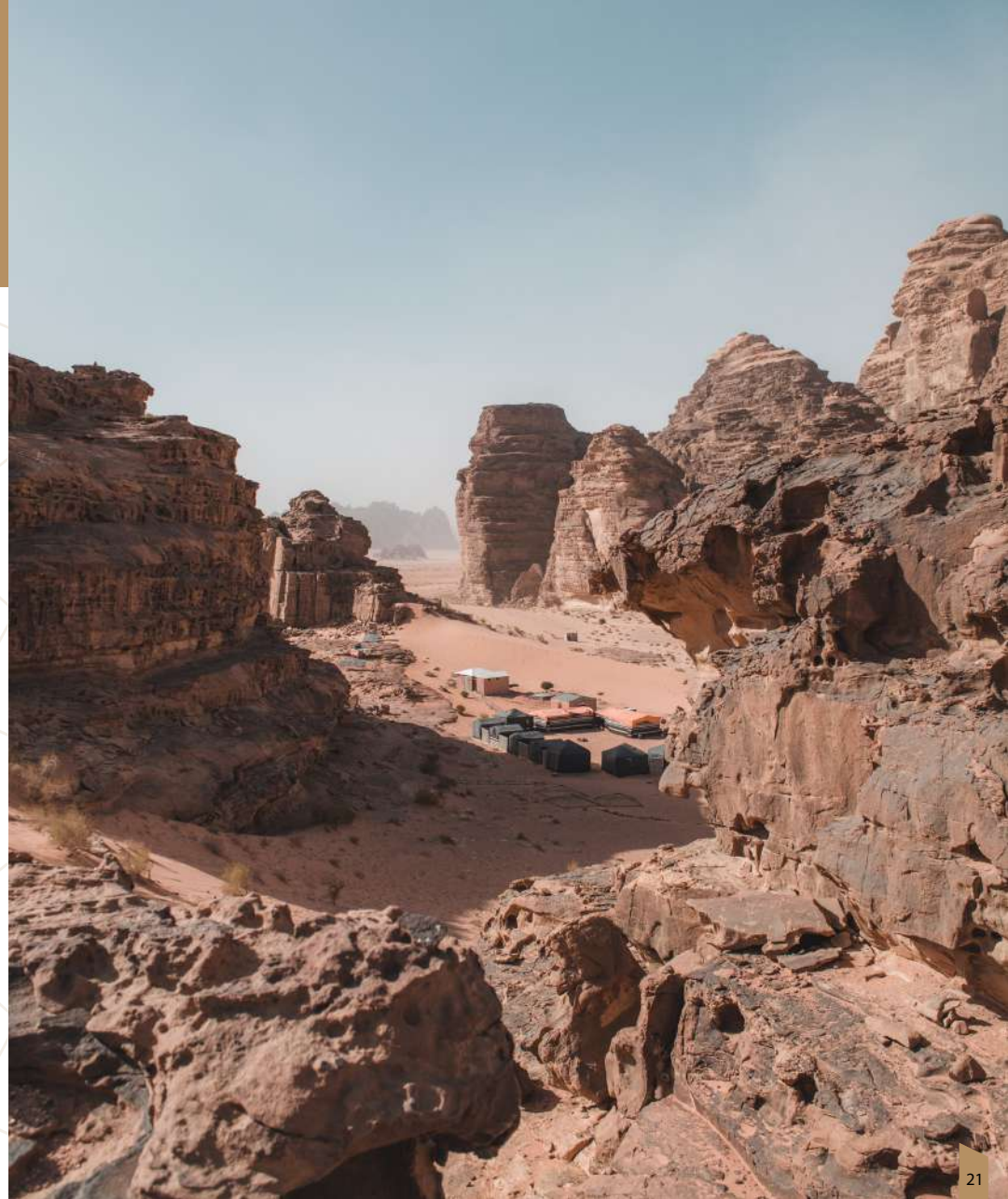


WADI RUM

The valley of the moon

Depicted as Mars in several Hollywood feature films Wadi Rum is an Arabian fairy-tale waiting to be discovered. Home to nomadic Bedouin tribes, Wadi Rum is a quiet getaway of stars, sand, and sun; a perfect complement from Amman's epicenter.

Once inhabited by the Nabataeans of prehistoric times, Wadi Rum allows you to get lost in large landscapes and horizon lines. The calmness of the desert is sure calm your spirit and de-clutter your thoughts. Wadi Rum is waiting for you.



Camel Riding

Camels are considered "ships" of the desert; they don't sink in the deep red sand, they float across it carrying their riders safely over the dunes. Camel riding is the traditional Bedouin way to move around in the desert. It is a very quiet and leisurely way for you to discover Wadi Rum. You will feel like you have been transported back in time.



Stargazing

Wadi Rum is a beautiful masterpiece of nature with golden dunes in the daytime, and a vast emptiness of starlight at night. At night in the desert, far away from civilization, you will witness sky as if you never saw it before filled with millions of stars shining in a dark velvet sky.



Time Travel Experience: Journey through 1916
