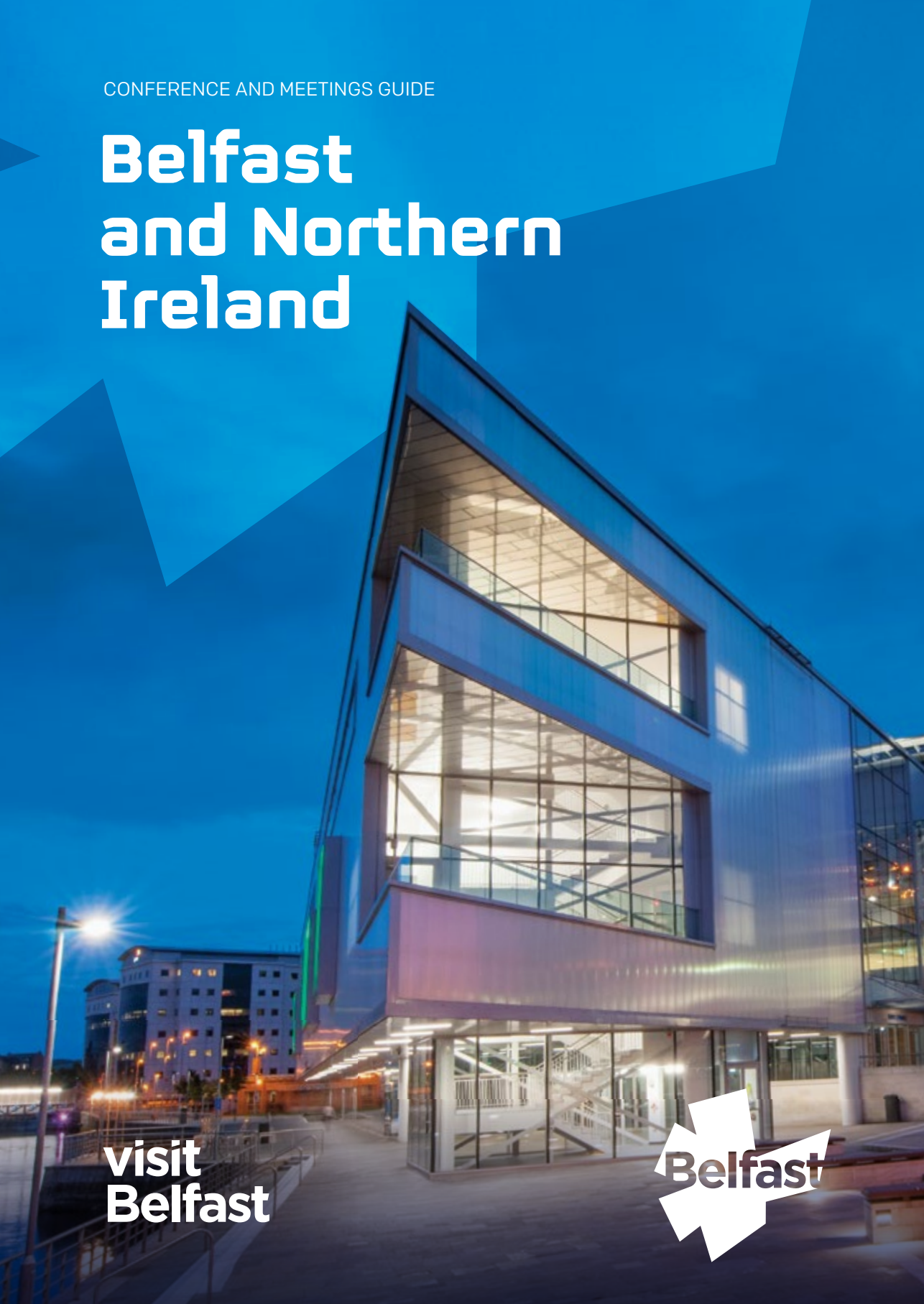

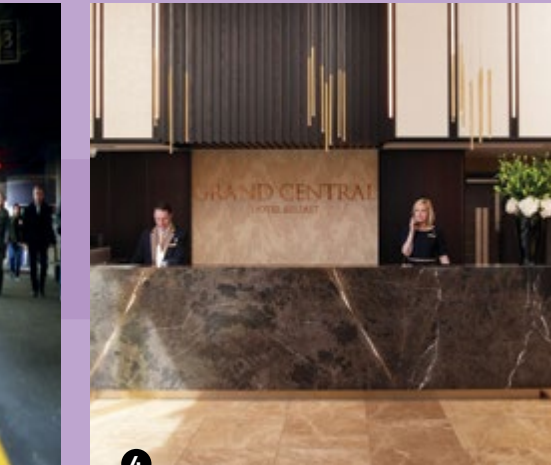

TIME FOR CHANGE

Belfast's agenda for sustainability

As a city, we recognise the huge importance in becoming as sustainable as possible. Many initiatives are already in place around Belfast. In fact, Belfast City Council has appointed a Commissioner for Resilience who is developing a vision and goals for Belfast for the next 20 years.

Some organisations in the city include:

Climate Northern Ireland

The partnership brings together members from a range of key sectors to share best practice and promote positive action to address the impacts of a changing climate.

Belfast Food Network

We are part of the ever growing Sustainable Food Cities Network, an alliance of cities and towns that aim to advance the cause of food sustainability nationwide. Belfast was one of the founding cities of a group that now encompasses nearly 50 members throughout the UK and Ireland.



For conferences taking place in Belfast, there are some key points for planners and delegates to be mindful of, to keep your conference as green as possible.

Transport

Mostly a walkable city so transport may not be needed once you're here. Bicycles can be easily rented through our Just Eat Belfast Bikes which offers 46 docking stations around the city.

Belfast Gilder - Eco-Hybrid Fleet – The engines utilise the latest hybrid diesel/electric technologies emitting low noise, low vibration and low levels of pollutants.

Our partner, Value Cabs, continues to pursue an environmental policy to minimise emissions provided by their fleet. 'At present we have an all-time high of 60% of all vehicles being low emission vehicles. This is set to grow as we encourage all our drivers to utilise these low emission cars.'

Food

Belfast is extremely proud of its food scene, and has previously been named the World's Best Food Destination at the International Travel and Tourism Awards. Many of our restaurants in the city centre offer vegetarian and vegan options, which can be better for our environment. A lot of the restaurants also proudly serve home-grown produce and use locally sourced seasonal ingredients.

Our International Conference Centre in the City, the ICC Belfast, through their catering partner Hospitality Belfast

champion sustainable, local food which appeals in all conferences. 'We believe that the return in terms of reducing food miles, improved traceability, flavour, authenticity and outstanding quality that we offer our customers is worth it.'

More than one third of all food produced is never eaten – and conferences, with their tendency to over-cater, can be guilty of contributing to the problem. Our venues will work closely with conferences to make sure they don't over-cater.

Ditch the paper and save some trees

We encourage our conferences to be as digital as possible and we can support this too. When providing marketing support for conferences we offer our downloadable city guides as well as promotion via social media, therefore reducing the paper trail.

Venue/Accommodation

As a walkable city, our venues and hotels are all in close proximity to one another. Many of the hotels we work with have signed up to WRAP's UK wide voluntary agreement, which encourages waste reduction. Selecting a venue with an environmental policy in place is a fast track towards a more sustainable event.

Eating out in Belfast is an exciting mix of home-grown flavours, modern techniques and the best local produce, with a restaurant scene that takes in everything from Michelin starred restaurants to the simple tastes of traditional fish and chips. It is plain to see why Northern Ireland was named 'Best Food Destination' at the prestigious International Travel and Tourism Awards in 2018.



Incredible Food Markets and Delis

A good market reflects a city's attitude to its food and award winning St George's Market is one of the best around. Step inside at the weekend and you'll be bowled over with the incredible array of local produce. The sights, sounds, smells and tastes of this place puts it up there with the best on the planet – it's an endless gastronomic adventure.

Also, explore amazing delis such as Sawers and Avoca, and those with a sweet tooth, why not visit Aunt Sandra's and get involved in a Chocolate Work Shop.

Michelin-Starred Dining

Book a table at one of our three Michelin-rated restaurants and you're in for a gastronomic experience to remember. The much-lauded OX, a 40-seat restaurant, is admired for its Irish beef and seafood creations. Book in advance for Michelin-starred EIPIIC, the flagship dining room from revered Belfast chef Michael Deane. The Muddlers Club is popular with corporate groups. Its theatrical open kitchen, industrial decor, irresistible rustic dishes and tasting menus make it one of the city's best establishments.

Fabulous Fish & Chips

Incredible fresh local fish from the waters around Northern Ireland is turned into the stuff of magic at the various seafood restaurants in the city. Multi-award winning casual favourite Fish City, is a must go-to, or if you're after something a little more upscale, try Deanes Love Fish or Mourne Seafood Bar.



Ginaissance

From distillery tours to tasting experiences, Belfast is a gin-lover's dream. You can enjoy an exciting range of gin making experiences by attending the Belfast Gin & Spirits School - immerse yourself in unique experiential learning at one of the spirit school events, including gin, whiskey, rum and calvados as well as master distilling classes, afternoon teas and bespoke cocktails.

Or while you are here, take a day trip to one of our local gin makers; Copeland Distillery, Echlinville Distillery, and Rademon Estate Distillery. If these options don't tingle your fancy, then why not take a Gin Jaunt around Belfast, learning all about styles, garnishes, cocktails and more.

Food & Drinks Tours

There are an array of enticing food and drink tours on offer in and around the city and further afield. Take a walking tour around the city's gastronomic hot spots or a coach tour that brings you to visit some of our top artisan food and drink producers.

Whose products are served on the tables of Michelin starred restaurants across the country. Why not try a hands-on cocktail masterclass or a cookery class, if you fancy a more creative approach to your cuisine.

Whiskey Tour Experiences

For those mad about whiskey, a visit to The Friend at Hand Whiskey Emporium, is a must. This unique Whiskey off licence and intimate museum charts the long history of distilling in Belfast. Learn about, browse and buy from their extensive collection with exclusive access to their own brand 13 year old whiskeys. Another option is to join the Belfast Whiskey Club and experience whiskey tastings in venues right across Belfast. Each tasting is unique and provides an excellent opportunity to taste whiskeys from Ireland and around the world. Or book an Ulster Whiskey Tour at McHugh's Bar where 3 different styles of Whiskey are tasted and evaluated.



City of Talent

Belfast has produced world-leading talent in financial services technology, cyber-security, health and life sciences, engineering, peace and conflict transformation, creative industries and medical sectors. The city is home to some of the biggest stars in arts, sport and technology and have produced many home-grown talents of it's own. Visit Belfast work closely with ambassadors from industry and academia to secure local support for events and business coming to the city.



Science and Academia

Northern Ireland is a hub of cutting edge research and innovation. Life and health sciences and precision medicine are championed by key local and international companies including the Almac Group, Randox, Norbrook, Teva, Terumo BCT and Bemis.

While local institutions including the Centre for Cancer Research and Cell Biology, NI Molecular Pathology Laboratory and Biomedical Sciences Research Institution are revolutionising life-sciences, dynamic NI graduates are leading the way in space science, climate

and nature studies, education, law and politics.

Queen's University Belfast is in the Top 200 Universities in the World (QS World University Rankings 2019) and is home to many of Visit Belfast's local ambassadors who support us in attracting conferences to the city. We benefit from a strong collaborative approach between industry, academia and clinicians.

Technology and engineering

One of Europe's leading cities for new software development and home to global businesses in



financial software, data analytics and encryption, access control systems and intelligent surveillance technologies, Belfast is one of Financial Times' fDi Intelligence's Top 10 Digital Economies of the Future and the top city globally for FinTech development projects.

As Europe's leading location for new software development projects, Belfast city is the world's number one destination for US-based cybertech investment and is fast becoming a global cyber security hub. Investment from companies including Allstate, Contrast Security, CyberSource (a Visa company), Fujitsu, Cayan, BT, Arris and WANdisco has ensured the pipeline of talent in Northern Ireland. Pioneering research and innovation, Belfast will also become one of the world's leading cyber economies by 2026.

We have a diverse and advanced manufacturing and engineering sector with experience spanning across aerospace and defence, automotive, construction, materials handling, electronics and consumer products. Our industrial and agricultural history has led the way for innovators across all of these industries, with computer science reaching into agricultural safety and efficiency while our shipbuilding and aerospace companies have turned their hands to building and improving wind turbines and renewables.

Arts and Entertainment

A mix of home-grown talent, stunning locations and world-class facilities has attracted some of the world's largest production companies to Belfast in recent years. Much of the city's dockland area is now dedicated to TV and film. Buildings that produced the Titanic now house some of the world's most recognisable sets and the city's streets can be spotted in many series. We've become a temporary home to some of the biggest stars and have produced many of our own including Jamie Dornan and Sir Kenneth Branagh. Off-screen, local companies have been sweeping up awards for set design, make-up and cinematography.

Every night you can find performances of all kinds in the bars and venues of the city. From traditional Irish music to jazz, pop and rock, even our buskers draw a crowd and the streets are alive with tunes! Meanwhile, some of NI's best stars are filling stadiums across the globe, we're proud to have given the world many superstars including Van Morrison, Snow Patrol, Two Door Cinema Club and James Galway.

When you visit the city, you'll notice an abundance of sculpture and art throughout. We're home to a wealth of local artisans producing everything from traditional giftware, Irish linen and glass to modern jewellery.

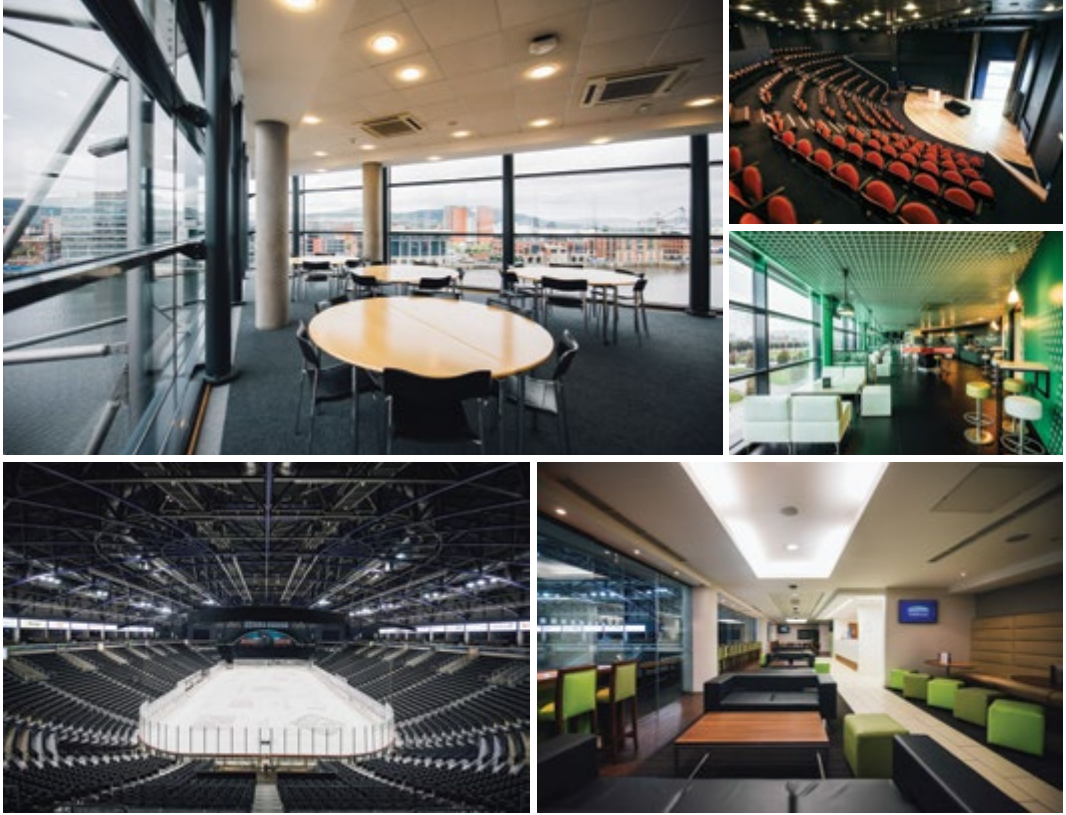

Odyssey



Odyssey is home to a range of first-class conference, meeting and event spaces.

Odyssey is a unique entertainment and education venue sited at Queen's Quay Belfast, comprising of The SSE Arena, Belfast; W5 Science & Discovery Centre; The Stena Line Belfast Giants and The Odyssey Car Park. As part of the Landmark Millennium Project for Northern Ireland, we first opened our doors in December 2000. Since then, we've hosted thousands of memorable concerts by international artists, state of the art exhibitions and thrilling sporting events.

Welcoming over a million visitors per year, Odyssey is one of Northern Ireland's most iconic venues. Offering a diverse range of stunning event spaces

and incomparable sponsorship and hospitality opportunities, our award-winning venue in the heart of the capital has everything you need.

Located in Belfast's thriving Titanic Quarter, Odyssey is just a short walk away from the city centre, 10 minutes away from George Best City airport and adjacent to major bus and rail links. The Odyssey Car Park, serving the entire development, contains a total of 1,500 parking spaces across the front, rear and overflow car parks.

Our experienced events team can create bespoke venue/room hire and hospitality packages to suit your event requirements.

Eikon Exhibition Centre



Northern Ireland's largest purpose-built events venue, 15 minutes from Belfast City Centre.

The Eikon hosts a diverse portfolio of events, including the Balmoral Show (Northern Ireland's largest agri-food festival), B2B and B2C exhibitions, trade shows, car and motor sport events, local and international sporting championships, large-scale theatre conferences and private association events.

The venue comprises of 10,600 square metres of versatile, purpose-built indoor event space in a 65 acres events park.

Event organisers will receive proposals tailored to meet their requirements and specific to their individual event.

Organisers who choose to use the Eikon for their event will work with a dedicated account manager, operations manager and venue manager. Each role is specifically designed to assist in the operations and logistics of using the Eikon, and to ensure all the necessary support is given throughout the life-cycle of an event to assist with the development and sustainability of the event.

The Eikon is situated on two major intersections, connecting the M1 and the A1, the main arterial route between Dublin, Belfast and Northern Ireland, with excellent accommodation link and leading eateries and tourist attractions within the area.

The Eikon is within a 30-minute drive of 70 per cent of the Northern Ireland population. Furthermore, it is within a 90-minute radius of four million people.

The venue has in excess of 4,000 free car parking spaces and state-of-the-art facilities and is specifically equipped for event organisers and their contractors. Facilities include thirteen five-metre-wide loading bays, 1GB fibre-optic broadband and bespoke event electrical and plumbing systems.

The Eikon has also invested in a large stock of event equipment, which is available to hire for an event or exhibition.

Its close proximity to city centre hotels, restaurants and other event venues, coupled with ample outdoor exhibition space, on-site hospitality, excellent road, rail and air access and car parking makes it perfect for all large scale events.

The Titanic Slipways and Paddock



Steeped in history, this is the perfect location for open-air events looking for an iconic backdrop.

Located on the exact spot where the legendary RMS Titanic was built and launched, the Titanic Slipways and Paddock has been the venue of choice for many global events including the World Police and Fire Games, Giro d'Italia Big Start and Carl Frampton's World Title Fight to BBC Proms in the Park.

The iconic 35,000sqm site at Titanic Belfast with the famous Harland & Wolff Drawing Offices and the landmark Samson and Goliath Cranes as a backdrop, the Slipways bring together Belfast's strong industrial and maritime history and Northern Ireland's resurgent future to create a unique outdoor venue space for 35,000 people.

St George's Market



Award-winning St George's Market is one of Belfast's oldest and most popular visitor attractions. It was built between 1890 and 1896 and is now one of the best markets in the UK and Ireland.

It has been selected for numerous local and national titles and awards for its fresh, local produce and great atmosphere. 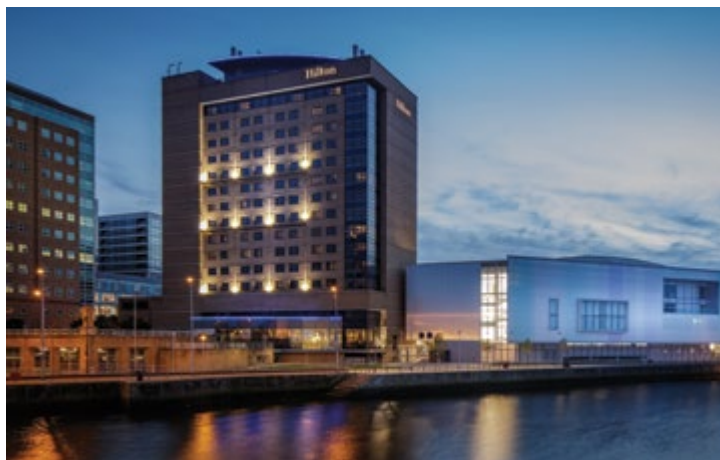

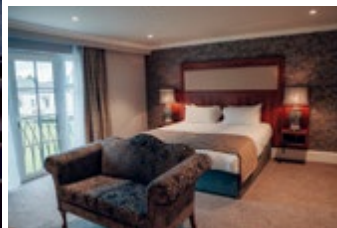

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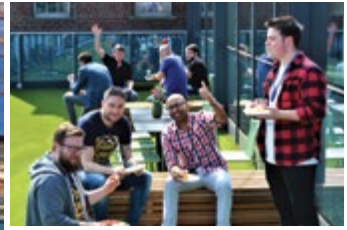

Northern Ireland is a land of immense variety, with wave swept coastal drives, hazy mountains, vast open moorland with loughs and glassy lakes heavy with fish. Explore our intriguing towns and villages or cosmopolitan cities, each with their own history and culture. Compact and accessible, it's a region you can tour at your own pace. So take some time out and go explore.

Derry~Londonderry

In 2013, Derry~Londonderry was host to the UK's first ever UK City of Culture. Dating back to the 6th century when St. Colmcille (Columba) founded a monastery, the city has been one of Ireland's continually inhabited settlements and is home to many historical buildings, renowned cultural venues and of course the 400 year old city walls. The city also boasts a thriving musical and literary scene to enjoy along with numerous city walking tours where visitors can relive the past.

The current Walled City dates back to the 17th century, when city status was received from the Guilds of London. The history of the city can be discovered in many of the key buildings that are located within the vicinity of, or close to, the city walls, for example the recently restored Guildhall, the newly built Siege Museum, St. Columb's Cathedral, Apprentice Boys Memorial Hall, First Derry Presbyterian Church, the Museum of Free Derry and the nearby Bogside murals. For something different at night, the city walls and many of these buildings are beautifully illuminated, with feature lighting showing off the impressive facades.

The city also has a lively cultural scene, with numerous galleries and performance venues, as well as renowned festivals and events that take

place on a regular basis – many of which now take place at the city's newest venue – Ebrington Square linked to the city by the impressive Peace Bridge.

Fermanagh

Host of the G8 Summit in 2013, Fermanagh is a county defined by water, so it is no surprise that it is Northern Ireland's premier outdoor location for water based activities. Take part in the many water sports that are available, visit some of the many islands dotted around Lough Erne, try your hand at fishing or even hire a cruiser and navigate your way from Enniskillen, along the Shannon-Enne Waterway, which links Upper Lough Erne to the River Shannon in the Republic of Ireland.



Marble Arch Caves Global Geopark is now one of 120 UNESCO sites across the globe and is the second of only two UNESCO designated sites in Northern Ireland. Marble Arch Caves Global Geopark is host to one of the finest show caves in Europe. Visitors are guided through a fascinating natural underworld while stunningly beautiful cave formations glisten all around. Prepare to be awe inspired.

If it is food you like, then Fermanagh is the place to be. Sample the locally produced famous Black Bacon, or alternatively experience and participate in one of the numerous cookery schools in the area such as the Belle Isle Cookery School or Orchard Acre Farm. If you want something more relaxing, spend a day experiencing some of the National Trust properties that Fermanagh has to offer such as the Crom Estate, Castle Coole or Florence Court. Spend time learning about the world famous Belleek Pottery or travel back in time discovering the history of the Gaelic Maguires and the towns two regiments at the Enniskillen Castle Museums.

Mourne Mountains

The Mourne Mountains are home to Slieve Donard, the highest mountain peak in Northern Ireland which rises to a height of 853 metres. This area is known to have been the inspiration for C.S. Lewis' land of Narnia in the popular children's books 'The Chronicles of Narnia'. Rich in flora and fauna, it is a paradise for walkers and bird watchers, full of folklore and culture.

As an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty, the area has many outdoor adventure centres providing activities from hill walking, rock climbing and mountain boarding to mountain biking, bouldering, fishing and golf. Indeed the charming seaside town of Newcastle is home to the famous Royal County Down golf course, one of the world's top ten links courses. Other golf courses can be found in Ardglass, Warrenpoint and Kilkeel.

There are many forest parks in the region, including Tollymore, Castlewella, Kilbroney and Slieve Gullion, each with unique characteristics. At Tollymore the Cedar Avenue is magnificent, and there are river, lake and forest trails of differing lengths, whilst Castlewella is home to the National Arboretum

and Annesley Gardens, the hedged Peace Maze planted with 6,000 yew trees, and the family mountain bike trails. Kilbroney is famous for its ancient woodland, walking and mountain bike trails and idyllic setting; Slieve Gullion's scenic drive offers stunning views across the Ring of Gullion, Mourne Mountains, Cooley Peninsula and Armagh Drumlins and has top class facilities for walkers and families. In the upper Mournes are the vast tranquil reservoirs of Silent Valley and Ben Crom. There are many walking trails showcasing the stunning scenery and the 22 mile Mourne wall also runs from peak to peak over some of the highest summits.

The towns in the Mournes area have their own stories to tell, such as the fishing villages of Kilkeel and Annalong, Banbridge with its linen industry legacy, Victorian Rostrevor and the historic City of Newry. To the west of Newry lies the Ring of



Gullion, also an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty. This striking landscape is an area steeped in Celtic mythology famed for its rich culture and heritage, and numerous prehistoric and early Christian sites.

Strangford Lough

Designated as an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty, Strangford Lough is Northern Ireland's first marine nature reserve and is the British Isles' largest sea inlet, internationally renowned for its marine, plant and wildlife.

The area is popular with tourists and noted for its scenery and picturesque villages and towns. As well as the main town, Newtownards, at the northern tip of the Lough, other notable examples are Portaferry and Strangford, separated by a short ferry crossing at its southern end. The area is known for its seafood restaurants and cafés and its unique crafts. It is associated with two great Scots, James Hamilton and Hugh Montgomery, who led the settlement of Ards and North Down, laying the foundations for the Plantation of Ulster by Scottish

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people, whose descendants came to be known as the Ulster-Scots.

Activities such as kayaking, fishing and sailing are popular on the Lough, and for the more adventurous the Sea Safari or canoe trails are a real treat. Activities on land include walking and cycle trails, golf, bird watching and horse riding.

There are also many fascinating attractions to be explored and enjoyed. Experience the vast marine life at Exploris Aquarium in Portaferry, or spend an afternoon at one of the two National Trust properties in the area, Mount Stewart House and Gardens or Castle Ward, which has mountain

bike trails in its grounds. Delamont Country Park offers waymarked walks, a miniature railway and the Millennium or Strangford Stone - the largest megalith in Ireland and Britain - while the large collection of native and exotic water birds and wildlife at the tranquil Castle Espie Wetland Centre offers an amazing outdoor learning experience.

Steeped in Christian heritage sites, the Strangford Lough area forms part of the Saint Patrick's driving trail - indeed the area to the south east of the Lough around Downpatrick is commonly known as Saint Patrick's Country due to its close links with the Saint, and is known the world over as the burial place of Saint Patrick.

County Tyrone & The Sperrins

The Sperrins are the largest and least explored mountain range in Northern Ireland and one of Ireland's premier eco-tourism destinations, with rivers teeming with life, mountains, valleys, forests, lakes and outdoor pursuits. With its scenic windswept hills, County Tyrone has a special appeal for walkers, who can then hang up their rucksacks in the Gortin Village hostel and relax after a day's hiking in the congenial main street pubs. Visit the Hill of The O'Neill & Ranfurly House Arts & Visitors Centre - the hill from which the famous O'Neill dynasty ruled Gaelic Ireland for over 300 years utilising a commanding 360 degree view of Ulster. Don't miss out on a trip to the Ulster American Folk Park, an outdoor museum which chronicles the story of emigration during the eighteenth and nineteenth centuries; bring to life the various aspects of the emigrant's tale on both sides of the Atlantic. Whether you visit Todds Leap for an electrifying range of adrenaline pursuits, the Beaghmore Stone Circles for a glimpse into the area's ancient past, relax with a holistic treatment at Angel Sanctuary Healing Centre,



enjoy a hike in Drum Manor Forest Park or marvel at 'The Tinnies' in Strabane. One of Ireland's literary giants, Seamus Heaney, came from the area and the Seamus Heaney HomePlace in Bellaghy, at the heart of the people and places which inspired him, houses an exhibition to showcase his life and works. The Sperrins and County Tyrone make for an unforgettable experience.

Lough Neagh and its Waterways

Bordering five of Northern Ireland's six counties, Lough Neagh is the largest freshwater lake in Britain and Ireland at 18 miles long and 7 miles wide and the third biggest in Europe.

Lough Neagh captivates visitors with its tranquil atmosphere, unspoilt scenery, secluded bays and skyward views. A haven for wildlife and home to a wealth of flora and fauna, the lough also has a rich Christian heritage, with the remnants of three round towers and one of the finest high crosses in the whole of Ireland, Ardboe Cross.

The richness of the wild flower meadows, woodlands, shoreline

and open water means that there is always something special to see. The lough has two main islands; Ram's Island and Coney Island, both of which have significant historic interest.

Whether it is the mythical story of Finn McCool or the more scientific explanation that you choose to believe about Lough Neagh's history, the largest natural resource in Northern Ireland is undoubtedly an 'eco-treasure'. There is so much to see and do from history and heritage, visitor attractions to land and water based activities. Lough Neagh and its Waterways is the homeland of Nobel Laureate Seamus Heaney. Visitors can embark on a tour of Heaney country visiting key sites in the beautiful landscape that were important in Heaney's life and work.

Lough Neagh Eels are famous across Europe. Protected by European law for their unique quality, you can sample them in the top restaurants across Northern Ireland, and during the season pubs close to Lough Neagh such as the Crosskey's

Inn, Ireland's oldest thatched pub, serve eel suppers along traditional music and plenty of craic.

Armagh

It may be the smallest of Northern Ireland's six counties but Armagh certainly has no shortage of history, culture and scenic landscapes. Known as the 'Orchard County' owing to the rich apple growing country centred around Loughgall in the north, each May the county comes alive with pink flowers in the apple trees, and the annual Apple Blossom Festival celebrates the start of the season.

The elegant City of Armagh with its Georgian architectural and Mall which is celebrated in November through the annual Georgian Day event is best known for its rich Christian heritage.

The city is a main destination on the Saint Patrick's Trail and has been known as the spiritual capital of Ireland since the Saint founded his great church in 445AD on the hill-top where presently the Church of Ireland Cathedral is situated. On the



opposing hill sits the magnificent St Patrick's Roman Catholic Cathedral. The adjacent Cardinal Tomás Ó Fiaich Memorial Library & Archive houses more than 40,000 books dating from as early as the 15th Century together with a fine collection of historical artefacts.

The city has many sites to be explored and enjoyed. Re live the battle of Barossa, part of the Napoleonic Wars at the Royal Irish Fusiliers Museum. The Armagh County Museum holds rich and diverse collections of relevance to the area. Discover the coin and art collections on display at No.5 Vicars' Hill or visit nearby Armagh Public Library and see the many hidden treasures such as an original copy of 'Gulliver's Travels' and Sir Walter Raleigh's 'History of the World'.

Step back in time at Navan Fort situated to the west of the city. This Iron Age site was once home to the high kings of Ulster and an ancient ceremonial site, and the myths and legends surrounding the site can be explored at the Navan Centre. The rest of the county also has much to

offer to visitors of all interests. The pretty National Trust properties of Address House and the Argory are fine country estates worth exploring. Also worth a visit is Dan Winters' Cottage and Ancestral Home where the Orange Order was born in 1795, and the recently opened Sloan's House Museum in Loughgall displays an important collection of documents relating to the beginning of the Orange Order, including some of the first warrants signed. Further afield, the Tayto Factory, home of the famous Tayto crisps, and the village of Milford, home of the penalty kick and the Milford House Collection make for interesting visits.

Causeway Coast & Glens

The 120 mile Causeway Coastal Route is internationally recognised as one of the Top Five Road Trips in the world adorned with an abundance of coastal villages, historic landmarks, beautiful beaches, country parks and the UNESCO World Heritage Site Giant's Causeway.

Join the route north of Belfast and stop off for a white-knuckle



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experience at the Gobbins Cliff Path. Continue along the breath taking coast road and delight in the romantic landscapes of the enchanting nine Glens of Antrim. Game of Thrones® fans will recognise several filming locations along the route, including Cushendun Caves (The Stormlands), The Dark Hedges (The Kingsroad) and Ballintoy Harbour (Pyke, The Iron Islands) among others.

Test your nerve and cross the 23m high Carrick-a-Rede Rope Bridge, from where you can enjoy uninterrupted views to Rathlin Island and Scotland. Catch a ferry to Rathlin Island from Ballycastle and be enchanted with its striking lighthouses and unique habitat, including a puffin colony.

Further north, you will reach the Giant's Causeway, a geological wonder, with over 40,000 interlocking basalt columns and a world class innovative visitor centre.

Stop off for a tour and a tipple at

the Old Bushmills Distillery - the oldest licensed whiskey distillery in Ireland. Make sure to pack your golf clubs as some of the finest links courses are located just a few miles apart including Royal Portrush Golf Club, which hosted The Open Championship in 2019.

History buffs will not be disappointed with Dunluce Castle, a medieval bastion perched on a North Antrim headland, with historic links to the early Christians, Vikings and Anglo Normans. Mussenden Temple dating from 1785, in all its dramatic, cliff edge splendour, is located near Castlerock and offers spectacular views westwards over Downhill Strand towards County Donegal.

All along the route, the North Atlantic waters provide the perfect playground for your favourite water sports – ideal for whetting an appetite to indulge in some award winning food, made from local produce of course. The Causeway Coast and Glens is yours to enjoy.

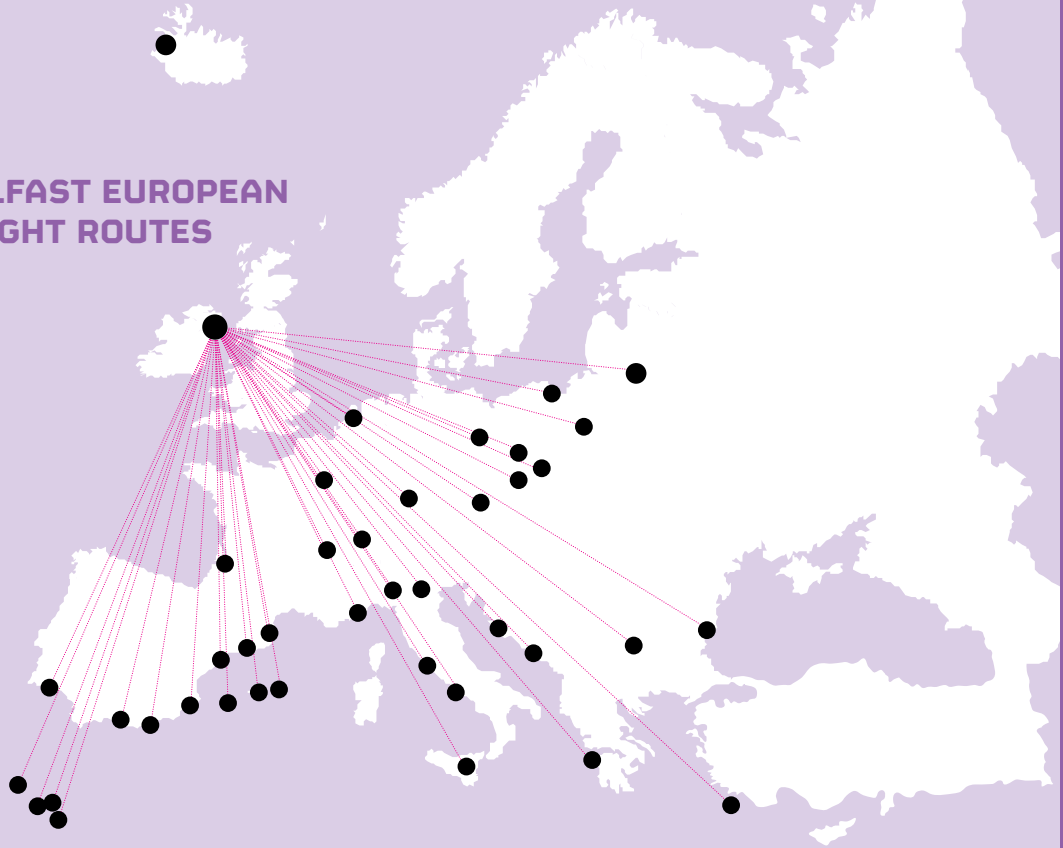

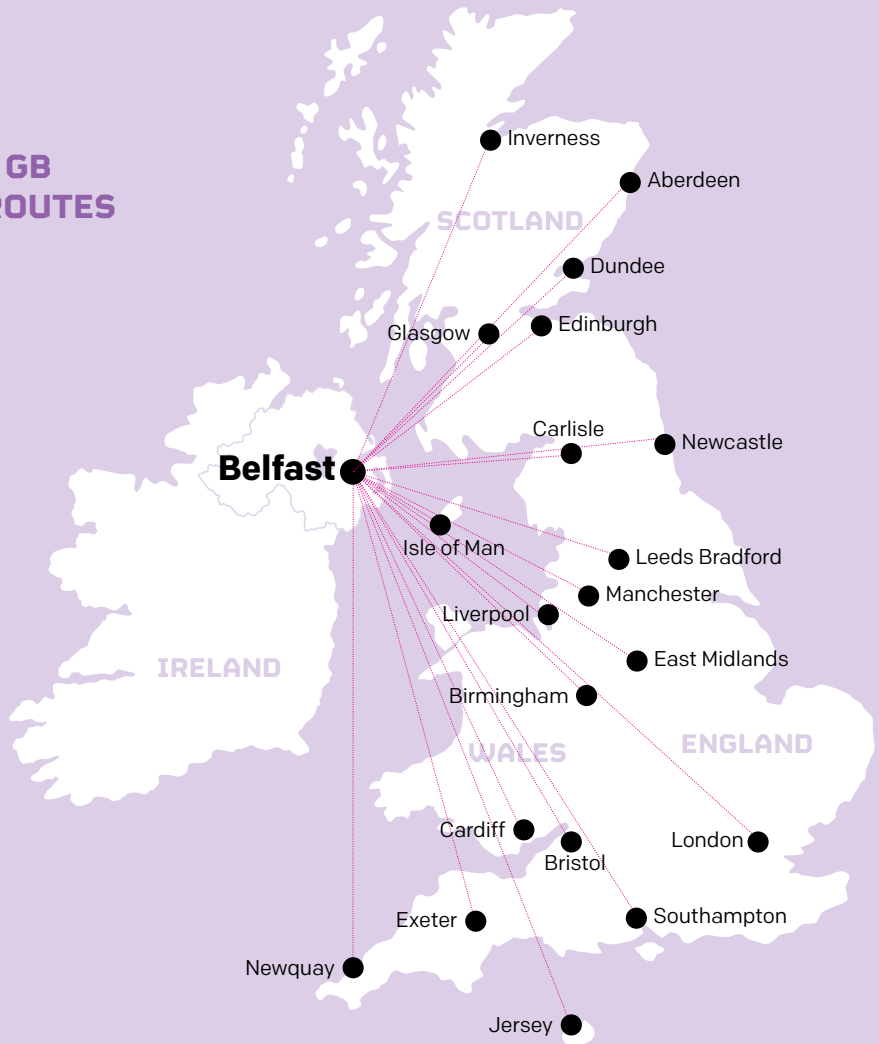

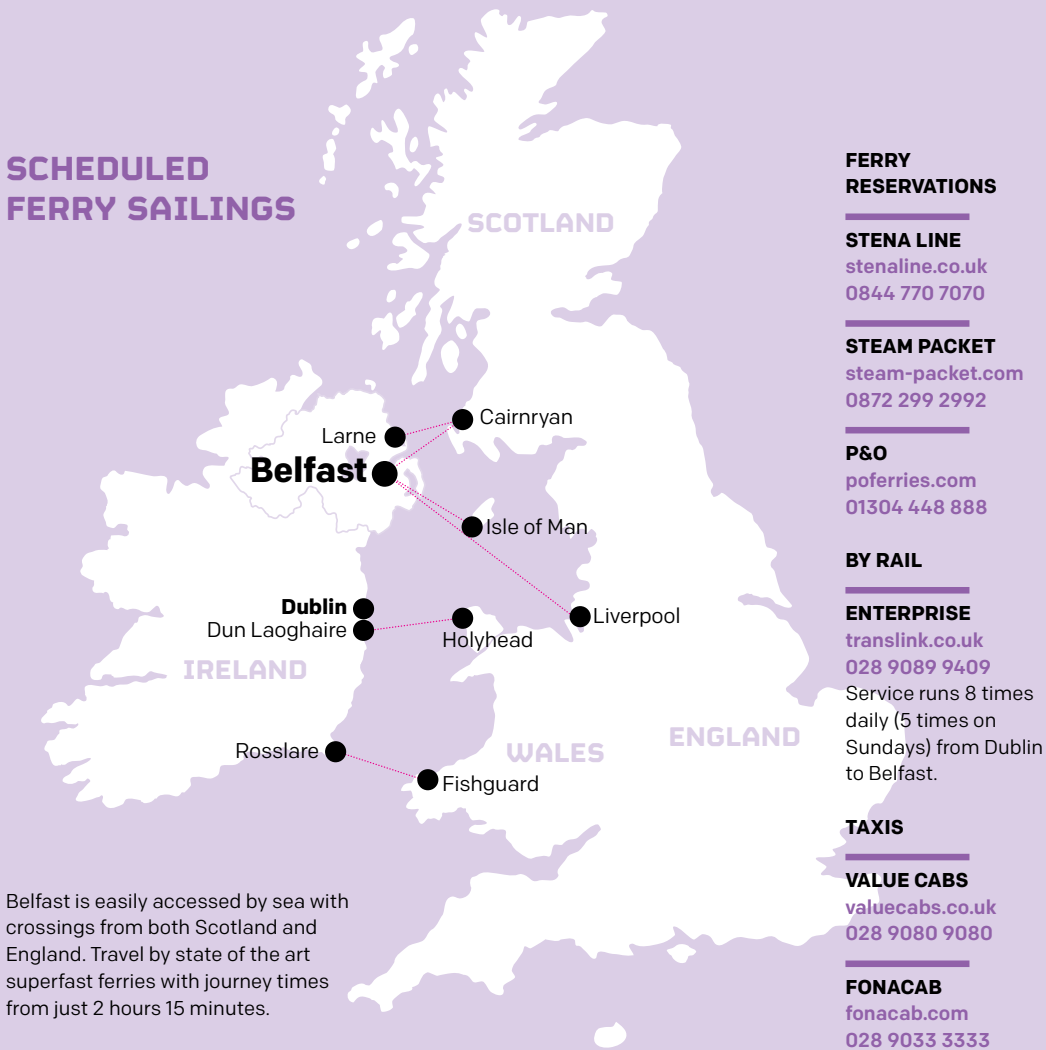
